

Irrigation Water Supply In State Believed Ample

SEASIDE, April 12 (AP)—A summary of Oregon's irrigation water supply to show good prospects in the entire irrigated area of the state with no shortages in any part of the state.

An annual report was issued by the division of irrigation of the conservation service, which does the work in cooperation with Oregon State college, the state engineering station, the state engineer's office and other agencies.

A statewide summary was after local forecast meetings in The Dalles, Pendleton, Ontario, Canyon City, Medford, Lakeview and Grants. Detailed reports for each area are included in the summarized summary just issued.

The above-normal streamflow forecast throughout the little actual danger from forest fires in streams used for irrigation unless abnormal conditions develop during the run-off period.

Detailed Forecasts
Detailed forecasts as to water conditions on the Columbia river will be made at a meeting of the Columbia river interstate water committee in Portland Wednesday.

Mountain snow cover about the state showed a trend water content in early 68 per cent above normal, 62 per cent above last year. Snowmelt is expected to average 50 per cent above the 44 average, which is 34 per cent above last year and only 7 per cent under the abundant of 1943 when a cool spring and rains added to the snowmelt.

Reservoir storage throughout the state is ample for all expected needs, with many reservoirs being passed water to the space for heavy inflow yet remaining. Precipitation accumulating in Oregon valleys since 1941 averages 118 per cent more than compared with 89 per cent last year and 141 per cent more than 1942.
