

Prospect Slim For More Tax-Reducing This Year

WASHINGTON, April 12 (AP)—Truman's assertion that "we are on the way toward a balanced budget" prompted the House tax authority to declare that the people will quit paying taxes if the government can reduce taxes.

Mr. Truman, too, cautioned against hasty action, saying in his statement revising previous estimates of the government's fiscal position that the existing tax structure must be maintained for the present.

Bomb Tests Aid Vital

WASHINGTON, April 12 (AP)—Truman, who once ordered atomic bomb tests in the Pacific, said today that the tests are vital to the nation's security.

He issued a formal statement on the subject, but without any explanation of why he selected the particular time to give his assurance of the new target.

However, Senator Hiram Boren (Okla.) recently introduced a resolution calling for the continuation of the tests.

Truman said the experiments at Bikini atoll should be continued "essential to the planning in the future of the atomic energy on our defense program."

New Smallpox Case Reported

SEATTLE, April 12 (AP)—One new "probable" smallpox case has been admitted to King county hospital here and the patient listed yesterday as "probable" has been confirmed as having the disease, the city health department reported last night.

The state health department, however, reports that no new cases have appeared elsewhere in the state.

Of the 38 smallpox cases listed in Seattle, eight have been fatal, and two of the cases still hospitalized were reported as critical, but both were in gravest danger from ailments they had contracted before taking smallpox. Both are elderly men, over 80.

"If this epidemic is to be stopped," asserted Dr. J. K. Bozeman, of the city health department, "every person in the state must be vaccinated."

Refuses Silver Star Citrus Fruit Prices Upped

WASHINGTON, April 12 (AP)—An OPA official said today that price ceilings for oranges, lemons and tangerines will be increased slightly next week.

The official, who asked to remain anonymous, said the increase at retail will be "negligible—a fraction of a cent a pound."

Producers' ceilings will be hiked, the official said, because of a legal requirement that farmers' costs increase.

He said the producers' increase in the far west will be about 20 cents a box for oranges, 28 cents for lemons and 22 cents for tangerines. The increase in other producing areas will be slightly less, he said.

170,000 Horses To Be Killed For Food

TOKYO, April 12 (AP)—The Japanese probably will slaughter 170,000 horses for food this year, allied headquarters estimated today.

That would be five times the number killed in Japan in the first year of the war. The expected slaughter will include 80,000 military horses unfit for general farm work.

TRANSPORTATION NEWS SP Plans To Speed Up Train Schedules Beginning Sunday

After a wartime slow-up in its schedules, Southern Pacific will speed them up this Sunday. Each train on the Shasta route will be stepped up from two to four hours.

Local schedules for the arrival of northbound passenger trains are 9:35 p. m., 11:30 a. m., 6:05 a. m., 3:35 a. m. and 3:20 a. m.

Departure time for northbound trains are 9:50 p. m., 11:45 a. m., 6:20 a. m., 3:45 a. m., and 3:30 a. m.

For southbound passengers, trains will arrive at 6:45 a. m., 7:50 a. m., 6:30 p. m., 12:55 a. m. and 1:10 a. m.

Southbounds will leave at 7:05 a. m., 8:05 a. m., 6:50 p. m., 1:05 a. m., and 1:20 a. m.

Freight trains will also be affected by the speed-up. It may be necessary to make some changes in the schedules after the first trial runs, but SP hopes to make these schedules hold.
