Modern Fire Truck Bought—A new modern fire truck to serve the Merrill rural fire district ordered here two years ago, was received Sunday by Floyd A. Merrill, company of Tulelake. The truck is a 500-gallon mid-mount pump for large fires, a 100-gallon auxiliary pump which is operated while the truck is in motion for control of stubble field fires. It carries 600 feet of 2-inch hose, 600 feet of 1 1/2-inch hose and 180 feet of 1-inch hose, all on double drum operation. The truck is 10 to 12-man crew handled and is operated by the volunteer fire department. It will be housed at the fire station. The truck was purchased by the Van Pelt Fire company of Oakdale.

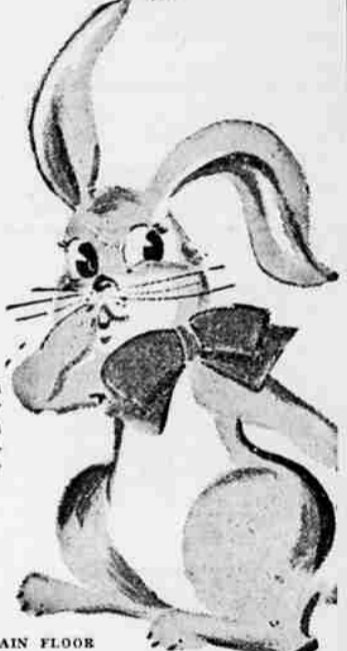
