

Garbage Laws To Be Pressed

With an eye toward a general spring house cleaning for Klamath Falls, the planning commission last night agreed to ask the city council to advise a stricter enforcement of garbage disposal laws and regulations within the city.

In connection with this, the commission will also recommend to the council that it ask the county to use a bulldozer to cover up the old dump site north of town on the east side of the highway across from Pelican City.

Fire zones, with particular reference to S. 6th, were discussed, and the commission decided to ask that the council make a study of the matter.

The group, headed by E. M. Jell, closed its meeting with a decision to ask the city to replant Mountainview addition in order to contour and replant the lots for 50-foot lots, enlarging them from their present size.
