

Chamber To Back Plan Of Growers

Klamath chamber of commerce directors yesterday voted to support the Tulelake Growers in their efforts to obtain use of army barracks at the Tulelake WPA center for a permanent labor camp.

The chamber board also endorsed the idea of allotting buildings at the center for use of new homesteaders who late this year will start development of new farms in the area adjacent to the camp.

Chester Main, president of the Tulelake Growers, was

present at the meeting and explained that the public housing authority was eyeing the Tulelake buildings and might take them out of the area.

Good-Will Party

It was announced at the meeting that the Portland chamber of commerce will send a good-will party here on May 21. A luncheon is planned by the Portland group while in Klamath Falls.

Correspondence was read from Congressman Lowell Stockman showing that the park service had arranged temporary use of a cable to assure electric service to the rim facilities at Crater lake this year. The old cable has deteriorated, and the chamber a few weeks ago asked Congressman Stockman to urge proper steps to provide for at least a temporary cable.

Buzard Will Head Chamber

LAKEVIEW, April 18—R. T. Buzard, Lakeview lumberman and prominent civic leader, was re-elected president of the Lake County chamber of commerce at the annual meeting held here Monday evening. Other officers named were Ray Harlan, vice president, and C. F. Snider, treasurer. Jack Mayne was retained as chamber manager. The executive committee is composed of the above officers and E. G. Favell, Gordon Smith, C. W. Ogle, Elmo Angele, Carl Pendleton, Larry Mays and P. R. Shulte.

Among other things discussed at the membership meeting preceding the election was the proposed street paving program to be voted on in June. The cham-

ber endorsed the town council's paving plan which calls for a general tax levy of 24 mills extending over three years. Estimated cost of the project, which has been laid out with a view to density to traffic and population, is around \$126,000 of which approximately \$108,000 would come from the tax levy and the balance from funds accumulated through gas tax refunds to the town.

The chamber also endorsed a resolution protesting Southern Pacific's proposal to remove the Fairport spur located at New Pine Creek on the Oregon-California state line. The spur has been used to load stock, grain and potatoes, and was put in good shape by the railroad company last year.
