Outdoor Easter Services Set

Members of the Christian Endeavor union are conducting a special Easter Sunrise service on the "hogback" hill above the "K" at 8:45 a. m. Sunday.

There will be no cross on the hill this year due to the difficulty of getting material and labor to erect one. The public is urged to attend this service which is open to everyone.

The program will start promptly at 5:45 a. m. with two hymns, "Christ Arose" and "Fairest Lord Jesus." Phillip Hitchcock, elder in the First Presbyterian church, will give the invocation.

Special music will be followed by the Scripture reading by Dorothy Whiteline, president of the Christian Endeavor union. After the congregation sings the hymn "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today" the Rev. Daniel B. Anderson, pastor of Klamath temple, will give the address.

Benediction will be given by the Rev. Charles J. Sundstrom, pastor of Immanuel Baptist, Shirley Robinson of First Presbyterian will be pianist for the Easter hillside service.

Merrill Presbyterian Community church will observe Easter with a service at 11 a. m., conducted by the Rev. Alexander Hood of Portland.

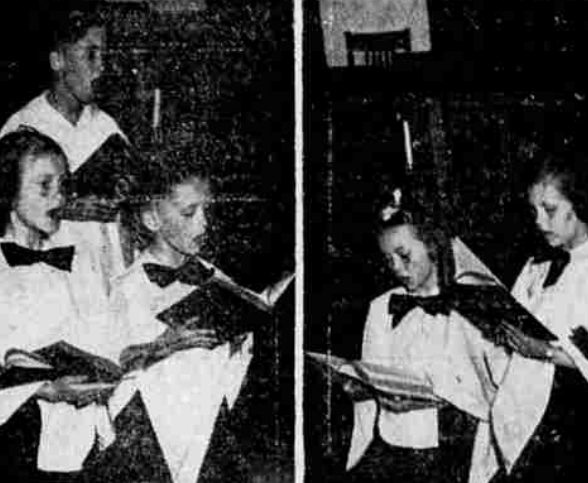
Special music and Easter anthems will be furnished by the choir of the church. A cordial invitation is extended to residents of Merrill and outlying farms to join in this service Sunday.

Klamath Lutheran church extends to all, best wishes for a happy Easter and a cordial invitation to share its Easter worship.

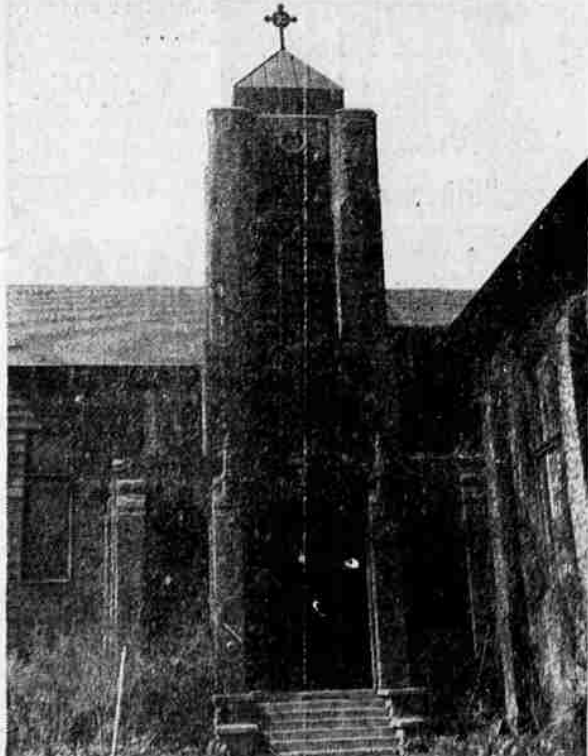
