Trucks and trailers will be placed on sale at 10 a. m. Wednesday, property may be inspected April 22, 23 and 24 at 835 W. Burnside, Portland, between the hours of 8 a. m. and 4:45 p. m. Items will be allocated by drawing, where applicants exceed the number of available articles.

Payments may be made in cash or the WAA will accept certified checks, cashier's checks or money orders payable to the United States treasury in exact amount of the purchase. Prices are marked on each item.

BOSTON, April 22 (AP)—A 16-year-old boy was charged in Roxbury district court Saturday with raping two women and attempting to rape another after creeping through windows into their bedrooms in the dead of night and threatening them with a doctor's scalpel.

The youth was ordered committed to the Boston psychopathic hospital for observation by Judge Samuel Eisenstadt.

Police officials said the boy's own statements were the first word of the alleged crimes, inasmuch as none of the women had reported the assaults.

Traffic Fatalities Increase In Oregon

SALEM, April 22 (AP)—Only nine Oregon counties had fewer traffic fatalities in 1945 and in 1944, Secretary of State Robert S. Farrell Jr., said today.

They are Coos, Curry, Douglas, Grant, Hood River, Jefferson, Josephine, Marion and Union counties.

Of the 352 persons killed last year in Oregon traffic accidents, 235 were killed in rural areas. One-fourth of the rural traffic fatalities were pedestrians.

Ranchers Busy In Poe Valley

Spring ranching activities in Poe valley are progressing with branding, marking and vaccinating calves and moving cattle to summer pasture.

Valley growers started shipping the first of February, diverting some of the hay to the San Francisco bay area.

Dan Liskey took advantage of opening trout season, trying his luck over on Sprague river Saturday. Dave and Jack Liskey, Guy and Mildred Barton, Ida Mae Brown and Viva Liskey departed, marked, vaccinated and branded 32 calves on the Liskey ranch. Each year cattle are vaccinated against blackleg.
