

Piano Pupils Get Auditions

Klamath Falls is fortunate in being one of the 206 centers where National Guild auditions are held for the benefit of piano pupils of the city and surrounding towns. Dates for the event are April 24 and 25, it was announced today by Sister M. Faustina of Sacred Heart academy school of music, chairman of the Klamath Falls chapter of the National Guild of Piano teachers.

The adjudicator to be sent for this section is Adelaide Anderson Richardson of Boise, Ida., a musician of fine training and experience. Eighty students will participate, the auditions to be held in the academy auditorium.

The guild embraces the American College of Musicians, the most illustrious names in the piano world, and is affiliated with the Music Teachers National association, National Federation of Music Clubs and National Music Council. Faculty members of Columbia, Yale, Juilliard, New England, Syracuse, and a long list of state universities are connected with the guild and scholarships are held in practically all leading music schools and universities by pupils who have passed the stiff examination leading to a National Guild high school diploma. Teachers who have their college degrees work for the National Guild collegiate diploma to increase their standing, and this month two holders of the Young Artist diploma are giving Town Hall recitals in New York.

Plywood Plant May Be Sold

SEATTLE, April 23 (AP)—The "contemplated" sale of the Olympia Veneer company, regarded as the largest producer of Douglas fir plywood in the United States, was disclosed last night by Attorney Cassius E. Gates.

He quoted the company's president, Arnold Koutonen. The sale price would be around \$4,500,000, an associate of the law firm of Bogie, Bogie and Gates indicated. He said a report that the sale was to reach \$8,000,000 was about twice too high.

The purchasers would be Lester and company of Los Angeles, and Lehman brothers of New York, Koutonen said, adding terms of the contract provided that the purchasers could investigate company affairs for several months.

The announcement said stockholders at a meeting April 13 approved a contract contemplating the sale of the company and its subsidiaries, the Olympia Plywood Machinery corporation of Olympia, Wash., the Eugene Plywood company, of Eugene, Ore., and the Pacific Plywood corporation of Willamina, Ore.
