Toward mid-session enough buying power built up to bring a price advance over yesterday's close.

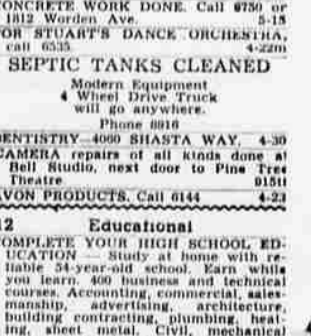
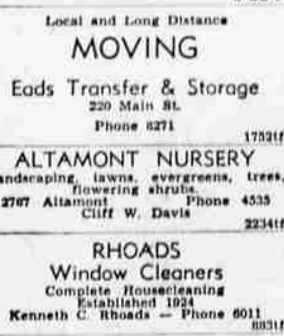
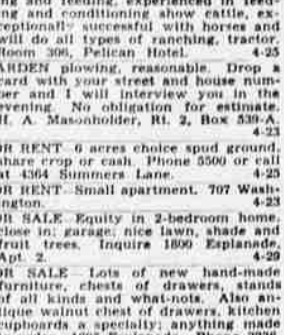
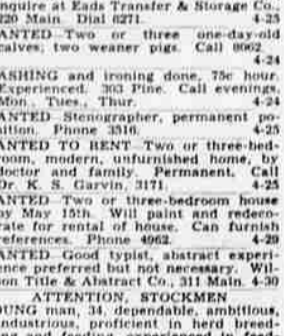
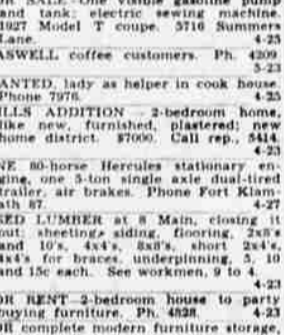
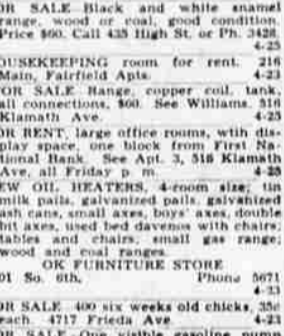
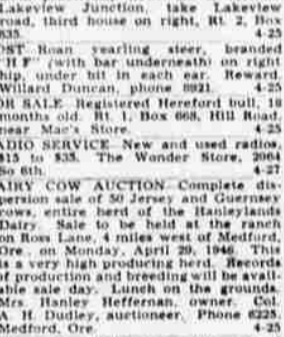
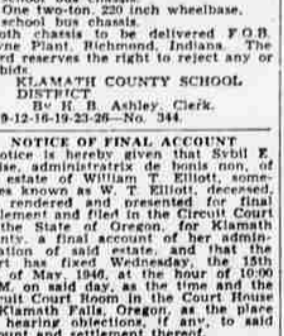
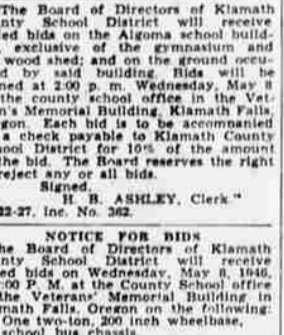
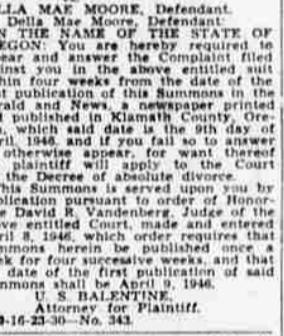
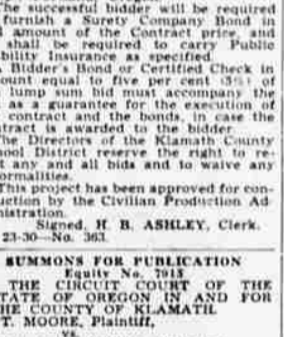
