Tulelake Couple Married In Reno

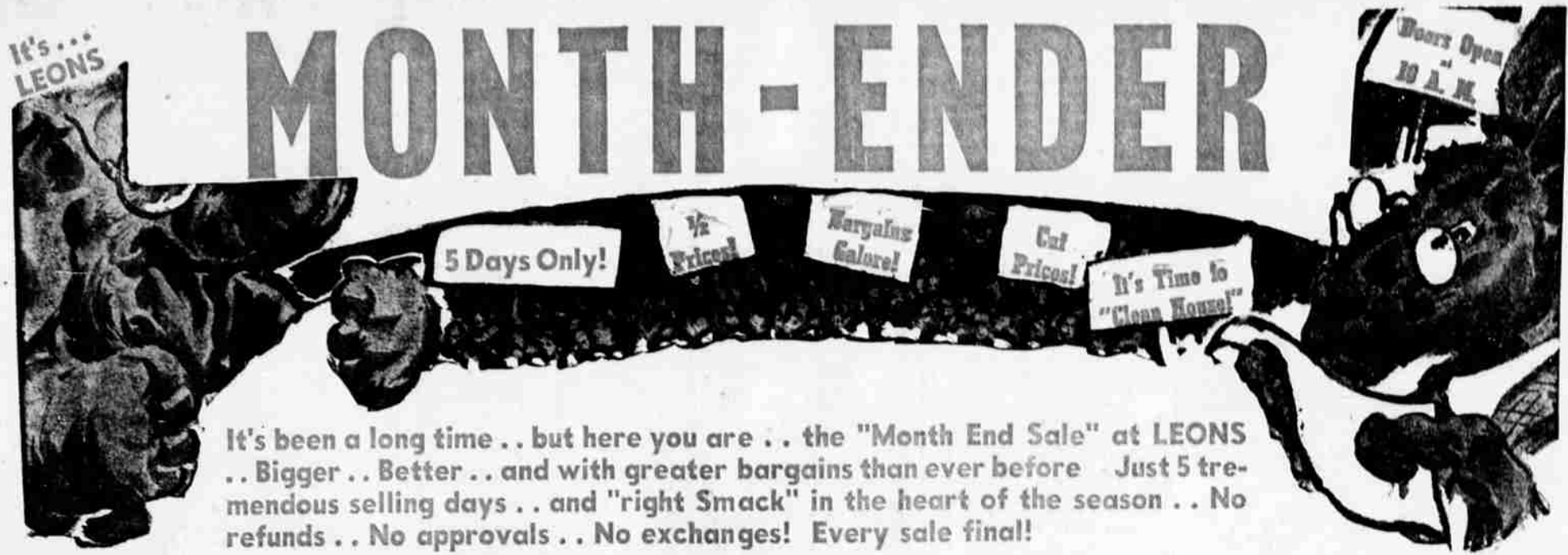
