

Farming To Be Affected By Price Support Plans

What kind of a national post-war farm price and income supporting program would be adapted to Oregon's agricultural industry is a big question, agricultural economists at Oregon State college say. They add that if price support operations are extended even beyond 1948, as is being proposed, the importance of this question is ever greater.

Many of Oregon's farm products are not listed for price support, including beef and sheep, fruits, nuts, vegetables, and many specialty products. Those that are to be supported include hogs, milk and butterfat, eggs, chickens over 3 1/2 pounds, turkeys, wheat, potatoes, certain varieties of dry peas and beans, and flaxseed for oil. Several other crops important nationally but not here are included for price support, such as corn, cotton, rice and tobacco.

Deadline Set On AAA Plans

May 1 is the final date for filing a farm plan indicating intention to participate in the 1948 agricultural conservation program. Klamath county farmers are reminded by Burrell Short, chairman of the county AAA committee.

Farmers who desire assistance in carrying out practices to conserve soil and water, check erosion, and build up soil fertility will need to file a farm plan with the county AAA office.

The college economists also believe there are other aspects of the farm income and price support measures that are of significance in the outlook for Oregon's agriculture. They point out that marketing processes probably will be affected one way or another as well as production. The effects on marketing will depend upon the types of price and income supporting measures used by the government.

The effect on marketing will be different if government buyers purchase small, ungraded lots in the country, from the effects if purchases are made only of cartons of graded products at a few central markets, they add.

World Wheat Outlook Good

Early prospects point to a world wheat crop better than the 1945 harvest. Another billion-bushel crop is in prospect for the United States. The European prospects are for a crop better than last year but below pre-war averages in many countries.

North Africa has good prospects. Early soil conditions in Argentina are favorable for the seeding of the next crop which will be harvested near the end of 1948. Australia is seeking a substantial increase in the acreage of wheat to be harvested in December 1948. Moisture conditions in Canada are decidedly better than last year.

The goiter belt, where the iodine in soil and water is low, is located around the Great Lakes and the Northwestern States.

AAA Assists Conservation

Good drainage, leveling, and proper control of irrigation water make highly productive cropland of relatively unproductive or inefficiently irrigated cropland. Irrigation farming when land is properly leveled and drained, if good fertilization and crop rotation practices are followed, is the closest approach to complete conservation farming. teemen recently estimated that this county required new drainage for 250,000 acres of farmland. 200,000 acres are in need of proper leveling, and irrigation structures to cost farmers in excess of \$5,500,000 should be installed to conserve soil and water.

In addition, 23 other practices are offered under the AAA program which help conserve soil and build up soil fertility. Practice payments under the program only cover a fraction of the cost to the farmers, but help him get the job done. Rates and practices are reviewed annually by local, state and national committees with extension and experiment station representatives advising. Practices are changed or dropped or new practices added when changes seem to be required.

How to prepare old-time meat favorites

There's nothing like one of these old-time meat favorites for satisfying hearty appetites and bringing words of praise to the cook. Most of them are easy on the budget, too.

SWISS STEAK
This perennial favorite always goes over with the men in the family. Although round steak is most frequently used, chuck or sirloin tip is equally good swissed.

Allow about 1/2 pound for each person, having steak cut 1 to 2 inches thick. Sprinkle with salt and pepper and roll in flour. Pound with edge of plate. Brown in melted shortening in Dutch oven or heavy frying pan. Add 2 cups of water, cover, and cook slowly for 2 1/2 hours or until meat is tender. Add more water, if necessary, to make the desired amount of gravy. Serve with fluffy mashed potatoes.

LAMB SHOULDER POT ROAST
About a half hour before the pot roast is done put in peeled potatoes, carrots and onions and you'll have a complete meal. Sprinkle a 3-pound lamb shoulder with salt and pepper and roll in flour. Brown in melted shortening in a Dutch oven or deep kettle with tight fitting lid. Add 2 cups of hot water, a medium-sized onion thinly sliced and a bay leaf. Cover and cook slowly about 3 hours or until tender. Add more water if necessary. Serves 6 to 8.

BRAISED SHORT RIBS
Here's another old-timer that's been a favorite for generations. Try serving with home-made noodles.

Have 3 pounds of short ribs cut in serving size pieces. Brown slowly, turning often, in a small amount of shortening in a heavy kettle with tight fitting cover. Add a cup of hot water, salt and pepper. Cover and cook slowly until meat is tender, about 1 1/2 to 2 hours. Serve the liquid as gravy or add more water and thicken with flour blended to a smooth paste with cold water. Serves 6.
