PORTLAND, April 26 (AP)—A recess until May 8 has been called for negotiation meetings between the CIO International Woodworkers of America and the fir employers' committee.

Ronald Houghton, special observer for the secretary of labor, sat in on this week's meetings, which concerned industry-wide proposals.

Tax Would Up Old Age Dole

SALEM, April 26 (AP)—A three per cent tax on gross income to provide larger old age pensions is sought in a preliminary initiative petition filed with the state department yesterday.

The proceeds would be divided equally among persons 60 years of age or more, and physically handicapped persons 18 years old or older.

Similar measures have been on the ballot in recent years, but all have been defeated. Sponsors are four Portlanders, N. Mable Grewell, Henry C. Menasco, Joe E. Dunne and J. A. Williams.

The measure would appear on the general election ballot next November if the sponsors obtain signatures of 23,108 registered voters by July 3.

Stage Strike Talks Slated

PORTLAND, April 26 (AP)—U. S. Conciliator George Brewer was to be joined today by Commissioners Oliver Goodwin, Los Angeles, and Harry Lewis, Seattle, in another attempt to settle the Oregon Motor Stages strike.

The three-man commission planned to meet with the union, the company, the mayors of Salem and Eugene, and possibly state public utilities Commissioner George H. Flagg. Bus service in the two upstate cities was halted April 3 in the walk-out of 300 striking drivers and mechanics.

Plans to sell the buses to a veterans' organization will be dropped if an agreement is reached with the union, A. L.
