

Churches Present Musical Programs

Dr. Peter Rozendal, Klamath county public health officer, and field nurses are conducting a well-baby clinic for babies and children of pre-school age to be held at the public health department, 1949 Main, Monday, April 29, between 2 and 4 p. m.

This service is free and is available the last Monday in each month. Mothers are urged to bring children in to the clinic, and newcomers in town are especially invited to take advantage of the service. Children are examined in the order that they come in.
