HILLSBORO, April 29 (AP)—Two teen age Lebanon boys were killed and two others critically injured west of here yesterday afternoon when their auto skidded on the Wilson river highway and rolled into a canyon 400 feet below.

State Police Sgt. O. O. Nichols reported the dead were Robert E. Ackeret, 16, and Hugh Leon Logan, 18, found dead in the car when motorists reached the wreckage.

Eugene Arnold Simi, 18, was

admitted to the Jones hospital here for treatment of shock and possible internal injuries, and Darrell Guinn, 17, was rushed to the Good Samaritan hospital in Portland with head injuries. Both were thrown from the car in the accident, police said, and were unconscious.

Fort Cafe Gets Lockers

FT. KLAMATH—After waiting since last October, C. J. Bricco of Crater Lake cafe is able to announce that he finally received his shipment of cold storage lockers on Wednesday, April 24. The delay was due to production being held up on account of the steel strike, causing shortage of necessary materials.

The lockers consist of 35 units, 210 individual lockers in all, and they are all-steel construction throughout. They are now installed and available for rent at a nominal sum on an annual basis.

Those who have already reserved lockers are asked to come and obtain their keys and make necessary arrangements for securing their cold storage lockers.
