COQUILLE, May 2 (P)—An elderly husband killed himself after critically wounding his estranged wife in a downtown shooting here yesterday, Chief of Police R. H. Crager reported.

Crager said Harry B. Steiner, 63, Sixes, died almost instantly of a bullet wound in the chest after he had shot his wife three times in front of a store here. Mrs. Steiner, 44, and her husband had been separated for about two months, Crager reported. Mrs. Steiner, daughter of Dr. W. R. Cartwright, Gold Beach physician, was taken to a hospital in critical condition.
