

Suburban League Favors Wide Use Of Fairgrounds

The Klamath Suburban league has adopted a resolution favoring the widest possible use of the facilities of the county fairgrounds by the public as a whole rather than by private individuals.

The league asks that the county

court assume a greater control over the fairgrounds and support, by a liberally reasonable tax levy, a policy of public use.

In its resolution the league specifies especially that recreational facilities be provided for the young people of rural districts and that a long range program be adopted to improve the appearance of the fairgrounds.

League members have gone on record as opposing the construction of a larger livestock pavilion from public funds other than the demands of the 4-H clubs require. They feel that if a larger pavilion is demanded by other groups, those groups should provide the necessary money for enlargement.

The county fair board, county court and other interested persons have been informed of the league's stand.

KF Man Seeks Trial By Jury

Harold Richard Gartin, 26, one of the two Klamath Falls white men charged with raping a 14-year-old Umatilla Indian girl from Pendleton, today waived a preliminary hearing and indictment by the grand jury and asked that he be given a jury trial in circuit court.

Arraigned in justice court, Gartin said that he had no lawyer yet but that his wife, Virginia, said to be part Indian, was raising money to hire an attorney.

He said that he wanted to plead not guilty and to have a jury trial. Justice of the Peace J. A. Mahoney told Gartin that he could not enter a plea in the lower court but could do so when he comes into circuit court.

Gartin was returned to the county jail where he is held in lieu of \$2500 bail. The other man, 22-year-old Robert Lloyd Farris, is also in the county jail.

Government Housing For Oregon Farmers

WASHINGTON, May 3 (AP)—Housing for 50,000 agricultural workers in Oregon—half of them processors and half growers—has been authorized by the civilian production administration, Senator Morse (R-Ore.) said today.

He reported the directive ordered the war assets administration to provide facilities including tents, cots, field kitchens and mess equipment, but not blankets.

Farmers and processors had appealed for housing at once, fearing lack of it would turn away workers.

Freewater Woman Is Mother Of Year

SALEM, Ore., May 3 (AP)—Oregon's mother of the year is Mrs. Howard Mansfield, 58, Freewater, mother of six, who is noted throughout the community for her work in civic and charitable enterprises, Governor Snell said today.

For two years she opened her home weekly to from 2 to 15 patients from the area's military hospitals. A charter member of the Federated church, Mrs. Mansfield has led campaigns to take children to Portland's Shrine hospital.

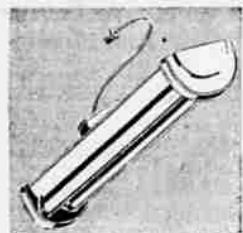

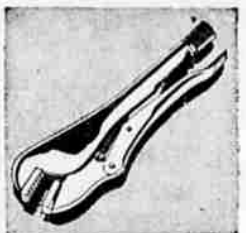

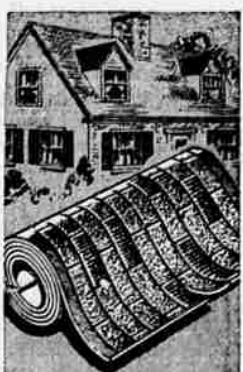
