

Fire Razes Washington Community

UNDERWOOD, Wash., May 6 (AP)—The task of finding new homes for 30 families and rebuilding every business faced this mid-Columbia river valley village this morning as townspeople returned to salvage a few belongings from the still smoldering remains of the community.

Residents slept last night at homes of friends in nearby communities after fires wiped out the cluster of business buildings and most of the houses in a few hours yesterday afternoon.

There were no reports of injuries among the evacuated men, women and children, but volunteer Red Cross aides at White Salmon, Wash., and Hood River, Ore., across the river, said almost every family had lost their belongings in the swift moving fire.

Winds Whip Flames

Neighbors joined crews of the Washington State forestry department yesterday in saving a score of outlying Underwood homes and preventing brush fires from reaching White Salmon, Wash., three miles east of here. The fire jumped the White Salmon river as a strong west wind whipped through the narrow Columbia river gorge here.

There was no official estimate of damage, but Hood River firemen said totally damaged properties and belongings were valued at about \$85,000 to \$100,000.

On the sales committee for 1946 are Lawrence Horton chairman, Bill Serruya, Elmer Balsiger, Klamath Falls; Claus Charley of Brownsboro, Warren Bayless, Hill, Calif.

Directors are Claus Charley, Burt Hoy of Weed, Calif.; Cecil Haley, Bonanza, for two-year terms and Joe Jacobs of Malin, Cy Williams of Prospect for three-year terms.

Facilities and barn space alone will limit the number of cattle eligible for show this year.

WASHINGTON, May 6 (AP)—Fred A. Britten, who as a republican representative from Illinois became noted for his "big navy" views, died at the nearby Bethesda, Md., naval hospital Saturday night. He was 74.

Britten served in the house from 1913 until 1935 and was chairman of that chamber's naval committee from 1928 until the democrats gained control of the house in 1931. He fought hard for navy funds all through the 20's when the emphasis was on scrapping ships rather than building them.

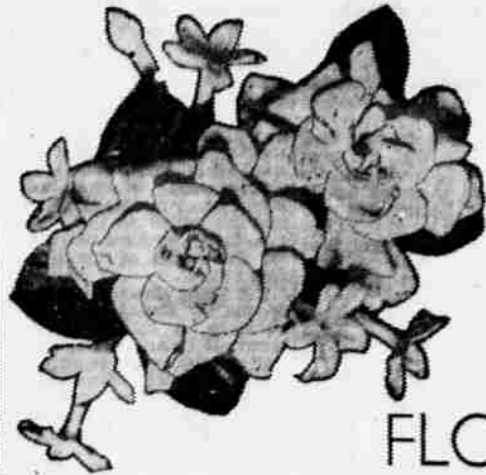
