

Truman Sets Up Board To Investigate Row Over Airline Wages

WASHINGTON, May 7 (AP)—President Truman today created an emergency board to investigate a wage dispute between 13 airlines and the Airline Pilots association.

The members of the board are to be appointed later. They are to report to Mr. Truman within 30 days.

No change is to be made in conditions out of which the dispute grew for 30 days after the report, except by agreement.

Principally involved are 2000 pilots and co-pilots of Transcontinental and Western Air, Inc.

Mr. Truman ordered creation of the emergency board because the wage controversies "threaten substantially to interrupt interstate commerce within several states of the union."

Named in the order along with TWA are American Airlines, American Overseas Airlines, Braniff Airways, Chicago and Southern Airlines, Delta Air Corporation, Eastern Airlines, National Airlines, Northeast Airlines, Northwest Airlines, Pennsylvania-Central Airlines, United Airlines and Western Airlines.

We desire to correct some mis-statements of facts about the Juvenile Department which have been made by Mr. Humble, present District Attorney, and some of his supporters.

Below is shown a portion of the Grand Jurors report of Dec. 20, 1945, which was prepared for the Grand Jury by Mr. Humble and which completely refutes his more recent politically inspired criticism of the Juvenile Department.

The Grand Jury is impressed with the reduction of 40% in the number of juvenile cases coming before the court in 1945, as compared with 1944. It considers this record a demonstration of what may be accomplished when all the law enforcement and recreation agencies of the community work together under the leadership of a competent judge, particularly when they have the help of civic organizations. It particularly commends Judge David H. Vandenberg, Juvenile Officer Faye Lucas, Chief of Police Orville Hamilton, and City Recreation Officer E. S. Bambrick, for their part in this worthwhile accomplishment.
