New ceilings on grains are expected to be announced in Washington today and tomorrow. May rye finished at \$2.72 1/2, off the 5 cent limit permitted in one day. All other grains were at ceilings, unchanged from yesterday.

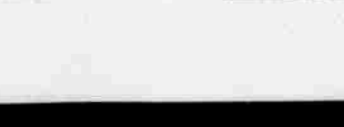
