

Snell Swings In Effigy As Students Swarm City

PORTLAND, May 10 (AP)—Portland's high school students apparently settled back to books today after two days of spasmodic demonstrations and strikes in protest of an anticipated school budget cut. The uproar, occasioned chiefly by students' fear they would lose sports activities, broke out Wednesday, and erupted yesterday into downtown parades, a march through the city, and a rally in a downtown park last night.

Central China Truce Reached

NANKING, May 10 (AP)—Communist and Nationalist government forces have reached a cease-fire agreement in central China that official sources said opens the way for resumption of discussion of the Manchurian problem. The truce was announced today by a Sino-American team upon its return from Hankow, scene of the signing. Attempts of General Marshall's committee to settle the Manchurian civil war have been stalled pending an investigation of communist troops that 300,000 government troops had begun a campaign of annihilation against 60,000 communist soldiers in central China. The feeble of the Siamese twins born Tuesday to Mr. and Mrs. Edward Hulse, Deep River, Wash., was drinking from a bottle this morning, as her sister has been doing since birth.

She was able to keep her milk down for the first time last night, and hospital attendants substituted a regular baby bottle for the eyedropper to which they had resorted. "She's a little better now,"

reported Dr. Joseph V. Springer, who delivered the infants—Carol and Susan. "The babies may be able to survive another day."
