

Police Seek Lad Missing Since May 7

Anyone who has seen Raymond Scheck, 16, since Tuesday, May 7, is requested to get in touch with state police immediately.

Scheck, son of Mr. and Mrs. Wallace Scheck, 2109 Gary, is thought to be in possession of a Springfield rifle. He apparently left home Tuesday while his mother was down town. When she returned there was a note saying he was "going for a walk to quiet my nerves."

He was reported seen in a downtown cafe Tuesday evening, ordering a large meal.

When last seen he wore tan trousers, brown and white checked sport shirt, red and black plaid blazer. He has brown eyes and wears glasses, is about 5 feet 10 inches tall, weighs between 155 and 160 pounds and has a loose build. His hands and wrists are bandaged because of a skin rash.

Raymond Scheck's father has recently been released from military service and is employed at the Klamath Falls post office as superintendent of mails.

Oregon Oil Drillers Get Dry Hole Again

PORTLAND, Ore., May 11 (AP) The Cooper mountain No. 1 test well 15 miles west of here has reached a 9263-foot depth without showing oil, and drilling operations will be abandoned, Texas company officials said today.

Drilling began in October. Equipment had been moved from Columbia county, which also produced a dry hole.

Girls Jailed At Pendleton

The two high school girls, one 15 and the other 16, who have been missing from here since last Friday, were located yesterday afternoon in Pendleton and placed in the county jail there, Gerald Murray, juvenile officer, said today.

The girls will be questioned there before being returned to Klamath Falls. Runaway charges may be placed against them there. They disappeared from town some time last Friday night after police had spotted one of the girls standing on the

ledge of the Kern hotel roof, apparently about to leap off. Investigation showed that the girls had rented a room in the Klamath hotel and had visited in another room occupied by two men during the afternoon. The men, Thurman Vaughn and Roy E. Cox, were taken into custody by police that night and were released on bail.

Vaughn and Cox jumped bail and left town, juvenile officials said, and investigation is being made to determine whether they might have gone to Pendleton.

The girls were found to be in Pendleton when one of them wired home for \$50. They were not together when arrested but are believed to have been preparing to leave Pendleton. One
