

Church Starts Food Drive

LAKEVIEW, May 13—From May 12 to 19, canned food will be collected by the members of St. Patrick's parish for the starving children in Europe and the Far East under the direction of the National Catholic Welfare conference with its western office in San Francisco. This drive for food will be in all the dioceses of the United States. The food will be shipped to the various sections for distribution to needy children regardless of race, color or creed. This drive is being put on in cooperation with war relief services. The private agencies, very close to the poor, in various countries will know where food is needed most. Announcement will be made next Sunday where the food is to be delivered for shipment to San Francisco. The NCWC was organized during World War I to help the suffering people in every part of the world and to furnish first hand news for the Catholic press in the U.S.A., as two of its main objectives.

Grazing Land Change Asked

LAKEVIEW, May 13—At the weekly meeting of the agricultural committee of the chamber of commerce, endorsement was given the request by ranchers of the Fort Rock area that some 108,000 acres of land in that area be transferred by executive order to the control of the Taylor grazing service.

Since the land, now under the jurisdiction of the soil conservation service, could provide better service for grazing permittees under the grazing service, it is the contention of northern Lake county ranchers that the transfer be made. It was also pointed out by Forrest E. Cooper, public land counselor, that the soil conservation service has no plans for development of this land.

The Lake County Stock Growers association also went on record at an executive meeting Monday as favoring the transfer in agencies.

The home land in the Fort Rock area was bought up by the federal government from 1936 to 1940 for the purpose of taking it out of agricultural production, for which it was unsuitable. While grazing permits had been granted they were for short periods of time and ranchers in that area feel that they can receive better utilization through the permanency granted under the Taylor grazing act.

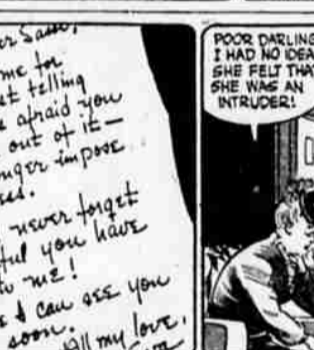
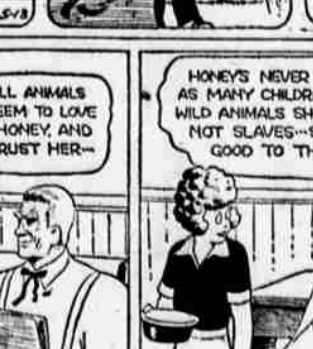
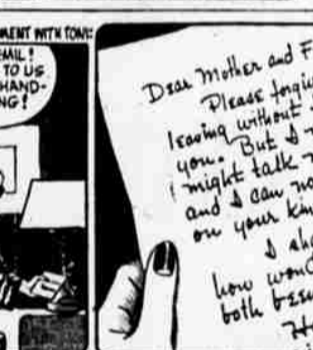
