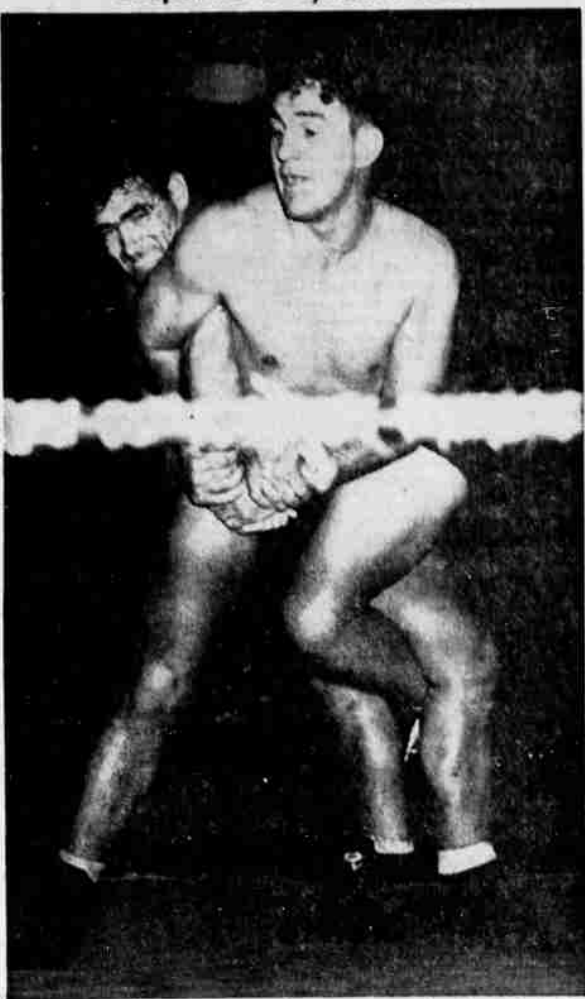

Hixson Will Fight Miller In Main Go

Lee Hixson, Medford middleweight, has been signed to clash with Chiloquin's unorthodox slugger, Bruce Miller, in the top bout of next Tuesday's boxing card at the armory. Promoter Mack Lillard announced today.

Hixson is an ex-serviceman and is now working as a truck driver in Medford. He gained much ring experience in army boxing matches and smokers, although he has done some amateur fighting as a civilian.

That fight will be the evening headliner, five rounds. Miller started on the opening fight card here last week, knocking out Bob Ross in the fifth round of their main event bout. He is a potent slugger but drops his guard and sidles about in the ring in a very peculiar manner.

Another five-rounder has been arranged between young Rudy Carlson of Klamath Falls and a Princeville boy, Bobby Morris, in the lightweight bracket.

Carlson also shone on the last card, tagging Jack Jones with a left to the chin for a kayo late in their second round. Morris is a brother of Dave Morris who used to appear in the fistie ring here.

Punchy Carnera Still Hopeful

ROME, May 15 (AP)—Cpl. Vic Jacobs, staff correspondent for Stars and Stripes, reported from Gorizia today that Primo Carnera, former heavyweight champion, had announced he would sail to the United States to the end of May to fight Buddy Baer in Sacramento, Calif.

"Win, lose or draw, this will be my last fight," Jacobs quoted Carnera as saying. "I'm getting too old for this game."

Carnera, now close to 40 years old, has absorbed four straight beatings from Luigi Musina, Italian claimant to the European heavyweight title, the latest at Gorizia Monday night.

Both the game commission and the forest service have been making a survey of the migratory deer problem and the problem of winter range this winter, and representatives of both groups will be on hand tonight to reveal the findings of their field observations.

John McKean, game commission coordinator, and Randall McCain, Fremont forest biologist, will air their views on the subject.

Lesnevich Clears Cobwebs From Lighthouse Laurels

LONDON, May 15 (AP)—Gus Lesnevich of Cliffside, N. J., still wore the crown emblematic of the world's light heavyweight championship today after knocking out Freddie Mills in the 10th round of their scheduled 15-round fight.

A springing of writers and fans protested Referee Eugene Henderson's decision to stop the fight last night, four seconds short of the bell in the tenth frame.

The crowd had cheered Mills on when he came back from four knockdowns in the second round and some thought he could recover again in the intermission between the tenth and eleventh.

Both fighters were reported eager for a return bout, but Joe Vela, Lesnevich's manager, said his charge might go back to the United States first to recuperate from a broken nose and cuts around his eyes.

Lesnevich's 40 per cent share of the net gate was said to be 12,000 pounds (\$48,000), while Mills slice was estimated at between 6000 and 8000 pounds (\$24,000 and \$32,000).

Harringay arena was jammed to the rafters with 10,400 spectators, including actress Paulette Goddard and a handful of American soldiers still in London.
