

American-Zone Germans Get Food Ration Slash

STUTTGART, Germany, May 16 (AP)—Eighteen million Germans in the American occupation zone were officially notified today that their "hunger" food ration would be cut more than seven per cent to 1180 calories daily May 27.

The German council of ministers, exercising its newly granted authority to make independent decisions, announced a 95-calory reduction from the previous average scale of 1275 calories in three states.

Vatican Hits Albania Rule

VATICAN CITY, May 16 (AP)—L'Osservatore Romano, Vatican City newspaper, charged today that a "reign of terror and persecution rules Albania."

The article listed numerous instances of alleged mistreatment of the Catholic clergy. It cited the execution of four seminarians March 5 and sentencing of four others to life imprisonment after what it called "the monstrous faking" of a trial on terrorist charges and the expulsion of the papal delegate in July, 1945. It said:
