

Seals Ward Off Thrust From Angels

Behind the precision pitching of eight-game winner Larry Jansen the San Francisco Seals parried the challenge of Los Angeles for first place in the Pacific Coast Baseball league but felt the pressure today from the ascendant Acorns of Oakland.

Jansen yielded four scattered hits as he hurled the Seals to a 5-2 triumph, yesterday, but the Angels reversed the procedure for a 5-3 margin in a seven-inning nightcap. This left San Francisco a game and a half ahead of Los Angeles, while the Acorns moved within two games of the leaders on a 5-4 defeat of the Hollywood Stars.

20-Hit Assault
Sacramento splattered five San Diego moundmen in a 20-hit assault for a 14-9 victory, and the Seattle Rainiers won, 4 to 3, to make it two in a row over the Portland Beavers in their series.

In the battle for first place at Los Angeles, Jansen struck out eight and held the Angels almost helpless in the first game. The pitcher got strong support in the fourth inning from Neill Sheridan, who homered with Ted Jennings aboard, and Joe Hoover, who swatted out another four-bagger.

Red Lynn started the nightcap for Los Angeles but retired in the fifth inning, and Clem Hausmann took over to get credit for his second win for the Angels.

Bill Werle of the Seals opposes Dick Erickson on the mound as the leaders and challengers square off again today.

Big Sixth Inning

Oakland put over four runs on six hits in an explosive fifth inning for a second straight win over the Stars. In that inning the Acorns chased starter Ronnie Smith and continued their attack on relief hurler Johnny Bittner. Charley Gassaway, treated roughly by Hollywood in a two-run attack in the fourth frame, was credited with the win. Floyd Speer replaced him.

Joe Demoran pitched the Rainiers to their victory over Portland, although he gave up three runs in the second inning. Roy Helsner allowed Seattle 11 hits.

In the free-hitting Sacramento decision over San Diego, Hank Jarrett, who relieved moundman Manuel Vargas, got the credit. The Sacramento attack was paced by Third Baseman Steve Mesner, who slapped out two doubles and two singles in six plate appearances.

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Leftlanders Upset Solon Opposition

Rival managers, who have been lefthanding the Washington Senators since the start of the season, have learned much to their dismay, that they have overdone a good thing.

Realizing the Nats possessed a lineup composed of seven lefthanded swingers, not including the pitcher, opposing mentors saved their southpaw hurlers for the Nats, with the excellent result in the first two weeks attesting to their good judgment.

In the club's first 14 games, opposing managers shot porters at Washington nine times with six of them gaining decisions over the Senators. The net result was that the Nats, preseason favorites to give their rivals stiff opposition for the American league pennant, found themselves trying desperately to keep out of the cellar.

Then, almost overnight, the Senators solved those troublesome southpaw slants. Whereas the lefthanders had previously tied them into knots, the Washington wallpapers began to pound their tormentors all over the lot.

Dodgers Shut Out
A lefthander proved a wise choice for St. Louis Cardinals Manager Eddie Dyer. With Lefty Howie Pollet holding Brooklyn to five scattered singles, the Redbirds shuted the Dodgers 1-0 to displace the flatbush favorites as the National league leaders.

The sweep of the two-game series with the Dodgers put the Cards 11 percentage points ahead of the Brooks.

The Boston Red Sox dropped their second game in the last 19 and their fifth in 23 games this season when they bowed to the Chicago White Sox 3-2, but did not lose any of their five and a-half game cushion, as the second place New York Yankees also were beaten, 8-2 by the St. Louis Browns.

Double Win
Cleveland came up with some grade-A pitching to gain a double shutout over the Athletics, 3-0 and 5-0.

The Chicago Cubs got off on the right foot in their eastern invasion by whipping the Philadelphia Phils 6-4 in a 13-inning endurance contest.

Jerry Liable of Mills was high pointer in the top bracket, winning the football throw, shot put, and coming in fourth in the high jump for 10 individual points.

Rod Davis of Roosevelt scored 10 5/8 points in the B class to lead that division. He won the

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60-yard dash and the running broad jump, and was a member of the winning shuttle relay team.

High point honors in the C category went to Calvin Gilmore of Pelican with 13 1/8 points. He won the 50-yard dash, high jump, was second in the baseball throw for distance and was a member of the fourth-place shuttle relay team.
