ON TWO OFFICES

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore. (To The Editor)—Since announcing my candidacy for re-election to the office of county surveyor at the May 17 primaries, I am being constantly asked as to what is the difference between the office of surveyor and that of county engineer. The ordinary person has no way of knowing or finding out the answer to this question. I believe the public is entitled to an explanation.

The office of county surveyor is set up by the constitution of the state of Oregon, making it an elective office, the duties of which are fixed by the state legislature. The duties, authorities and powers of the surveyor are defined in Sections 87-301 to 87-330, O. C. L. A., 1940, and in amendments to these laws since 1940.

The duties of the surveyor are of two kinds, namely: (1)—Those fixed by the legislature which might be called mandatory, which have to do with surveys, lines, corners, survey records, etc.; and (2)—Those which are performed only at the direction of the county court, most of which have to do with the survey, establishment and vacation of county roads, and the keeping of road records. The office of county surveyor is in no way connected with the construction and maintenance of county roads. The law provides for a county roadmaster to do that.

The county court was allowed to appoint a county engineer by the market road law of 1919. The engineer's duties as provided by that law have to do only with market roads. The effectiveness of that law was destroyed by the creation of the secondary state highway system in 1931, and, from then on, market roads were no different from ordinary county roads. In fact, Klamath county, along with a number of other counties in the state, no longer budgets for market roads, and in reality has discontinued the system. The only part of the law in operation in this county is the section permitting the appointment of a county engineer. Outside of the market road law, there is no need for, nor no legal provision for a county engineer.
