

Potato Tests Are Accurate

Potato sampling for seed certification from the 1945 crop appears to have been very accurate. J. R. McCambridge, extension specialist in seed certification at OSC said on his return from a check of Oregon seed planted in Kern county, Calif. Dr. J. A. Milbrath, associate plant pathologist, and McCambridge spent a week in Kern county checking the number of diseased potato plants in fields representing 15 lots of Oregon potatoes against sample production tests read early this year at Oceanside, Calif., on the same lots. The disease counts checked closely with the previous samples tested at Oceanside, under the seed certification program, McCambridge explained.

The field checks indicate that representative sampling of last year's crop of potatoes in the field or bin under the seed certification program was satisfactory. The true condition of the seedstock was correctly analyzed prior to field planting. Though this one year's check is not a research project, it indicates that the test plot samples at Oceanside are a good indication of the quality of the seed, Oregon certification specialists conclude.

Vets Get Bulk Of Machinery

That veterans returning to farms are getting most of Oregon's share of the dwindling supply of new farm machinery is evidenced by reports from county AAA committees on veterans' preference certificates issued during the preceding month.

The state PMA office reports that county committees during the period March 21 to April 20 received 653 applications from veterans, issued 540 certificates and granted 548 extensions on certificates previously issued which had not been filled before the expiration dates. A total of 129 certificates were satisfied by dealers during the period. During the period March 21 to

April 20, Klamath county received 38 applications from veterans, issued 36 certificates and granted extensions on 17 certificates. Twelve certificates were reported filled by dealers during that period.

Earwigs Again Menace Crops

Earwigs are again becoming destructive in the flowers and vegetable gardens in the county. Control measures are best if applied now.

Poison bran mash is the standard remedy for earwig control. The following formula is recommended by the county agent's office: bran 12 pounds, sodium fluosilicate 1 pound, fish oil 1 quart. Mix dry bran and sodium fluosilicate, then add fish oil and mix again. Use no water. Scatter the bait along fences, piles of boards, woodpiles, trees or other places where earwigs may hide. The poison also is scattered over the lawn, after which it is

best to wait two days before sprinkling the lawn again. The formula given is enough for one application to an area 8000 square feet. The mixture can be varied according to the area to treat if the proportions are the same.

Since earwigs are active mostly at night, the bait is best applied in late evening. The poison bran is poisonous to man, poultry and livestock and they should be prevented from eating the mixture.

REPORT on PROPOSED Starch and Glucose POTATO FACTORY

A joint meeting of the Starch and Glucose committee, Tulelake Growers, and Klamath Potato Growers Activities Committee held in Tulelake Growers office May 1st decided a representative committee of both associations make a trip of inspection to Wenatchee, Wash., to inspect the Northwest Chemurgy Co-operative and take along a certified public accountant.

The purpose: to clarify the financial condition and the handling of money being put in escrow here for construction of a starch and glucose plant in the Klamath Basin.

The undersigned committee made the inspection May 9th. Mr. Paul Matthews, local C.P.A., was given access to all accounting. Mr. Matthews gave a very favorable report to a joint committee at a meeting in Tulelake May 14th. The committee believes Northwest Chemurgy Co-operative is doing a good job. The published letter definitely states how local money is to be handled.

Dear Mr. Main:

This is to confirm our discussion and agreement today in regard to the working out of an arrangement for a trusteeship during our construction of a starch factory to be located in the Klamath Basin.

It is understood that at the present time there is in effect an Escrow Agreement with the Klamath Falls Branch of the First National Bank of Portland whereby growers have deposited money with said bank which are to be turned over to us when \$100,000.00 has been so deposited and we commit ourselves to build a starch and glucose factory in the Klamath Falls area.

We agree on or before the fulfillment of the Escrow with the above named bank to prepare and deliver a trust instrument authorizing and directing said bank as escrow holder, to pay over to a trustee to be appointed by us and agreeable to you the money which are now payable to us under the terms of said Escrow Agreement, which money are to be held and disbursed by said trustee for the sole purpose of paying for the construction and equipment of said starch factory and the expenses incurred by us incidental thereto. The trustee shall pay over said money as needed upon signed order of such officer or agent of Northwest Chemurgy Co-operative as may be designated by the president, such order to state the purpose for which the money is to be used or paid. When such cost and expense has been fully paid, any money remaining in the hands of said trustee shall be forthwith paid to us and the trustee thereupon shall be discharged.
