

Dairy Plans Require O. K. From State

Dairymen who either are building or contemplate building milk houses may save themselves time and money by ascertaining that such construction and equipment meet state requirements for the grade of milk they sell. Such plans may be submitted for approval or suggestions to C. R. Jester, Box 1503, Medford, who is the representative of the state department of agriculture, division of foods and dairies for Klamath, Jackson and Josephine counties. Or they may be sent direct to the department headquarters at Salem.

State regulations require certain types of materials as well as construction. Materials going into construction of milk houses should be moisture proof. On this point, Jester says, pumice building blocks are not impervious to moisture unless they are plastered with cement or otherwise treated so they will not be too absorbent.

Jester says also that he was advised while in Salem recently to attend a division conference in connection with the new fluid milk regulations that the department is now receiving from those in charge of federal testing for Bang's disease up-to-the-minute reports on location of reactors. As a result, the division is now in a position for the first time to enforce that portion of the so-called pasteurization law relating to raw milk sold in bottles.

Briefly, this law requires that in herds where reactors are found, the herd be tested at intervals of 15 to 21 days for four tests. If reactors are found and removed after each test, and no reactors found on the fourth test, the herd will be disease-free. If, however, on the fourth test, Bang's disease reactors are found again, as far as the sale of raw milk is concerned, the milk must be pasteurized if sold in the bottle and can trade. It does not apply to dairies producing raw milk for pasteurization, as milk which is pasteurized eliminates any danger of undulant fever, which is the human form of Bang's disease.

Dairy Production Payments Increase

Subsidy rates under the dairy production payment program during May and June will be 55 cents per hundredweight for milk and 15 cents per pound for butterfat in all Oregon counties. These rates are 20 cents per hundredweight of milk and five cents per pound of butterfat over rates paid in May and June of last year, previously an

Bale Tie Shortage Hits Hay Growers

Hay producers who are planning on baling their 1946 crop must either make sure immediately that they can secure enough bale ties to meet their needs or start making other plans to handle their production. Following a survey which revealed that Oregon distributors were forced to cancel most of their orders from dealers, E. Harvey Miller, state PMA director, has requested Washington authorities to divert a supply of bale ties from areas with later haying season.

There is slight hope of easing the situation, however, as production of ties during the first half of the year is expected to be 25,000 to 30,000 tons short of demands. Continuous production at full capacity after an early settlement of the coal strike still would be insufficient to fulfill the 110,000-ton demand estimated for the year.

Azalea Show At Brookings

BROOKINGS, May 16 — A flower show of national interest will be held here May 25, in conjunction with the post-war revived Azalea Festival. Some Farm Permits Carry No Priority

Permits for farm construction issued by the state PMA committee do not necessarily carry priorities for materials. The authorizations are issued by the PMA committee under the new veterans' housing program requiring advance approval for all construction in excess of certain cost limitations.

"HH" priorities for lumber and other materials can be issued by the PMA committee only for construction of farm houses. In the case of other farm buildings, such as barns and storage warehouses, the authorization carries only permission to begin construction. Farmers can obtain
