Stock Swindle Warning Given

SALEM, May 21 (AP)—State Comptroller Commissioner Maurice Hudson warned today that persons should investigate before they invest in securities, citing the many fraudulent schemes that are being promoted. Hudson particularly warned veterans and holders of war bonds, who appear the main targets of the fraudulent promoters. He said that persons thinking of buying securities first should check with a registered securities dealer, a banker or the state corporation department to see if the would-be seller is registered. Hudson said Canadian promoters are phoning Oregon residents, often from as far away as Toronto, offering stock in a non-existent gold mine. Hudson said he has no control over these promoters, but that the United States may enter into a treaty with Canada to correct the situation. He added that illegitimate dealers usually want to close the deal at once so that the buyer won't have time to investigate him. Hudson said, however, he would not give advice on how to play the stock market.

Treasure Hunt Started Again

NEAHKAHNE, Ore., May 21 (AP)—The treasure hunt has started again on the steep slope of Neahkahnie mountain, where Indian legend and mysteriously marked rocks indicate shipwrecked sailors once buried their treasure loot. Four partners in the latest venture to unearth whatever the Spanish adventurers hid in the prominence along the rugged Oregon coast are using bulldozers and electronic aids. Charles W. Pike, Bay City, who has searched the mountain sands for 36 years for trace of the legendary loot, believes the new effort will be successful if any treasure is buried. Pike reported no indications of "filled in" land have been uncovered by the bulldozers. Several "Spanish treasure rocks" discovered many years ago have led many others to search the mountain. Pike's partners are Milo A. Merrill, Bremerton, Wash., and Harve H. Tuttle, Seattle, and Barney Lucas, Gearhart, Ore.

Geophysical Work Planned In Alaska

WASHINGTON, May 21 (AP)—Construction of a \$975,000 geophysical institute at the University of Alaska is proposed in a bill introduced by Delegate Bartlett of Alaska. The bill provides that the buildings would become the property of the university. The university would furnish utilities and custodial services and would staff the institute. Such an institute, the bill said, could lead to increases in supplies and reserves of important minerals and could furnish valuable information for military and non-military projects.

P. O. Employees Get Pay Raises

WASHINGTON, May 21 (AP)—President Truman signed into law today a bill giving nearly all postal workers a \$400 yearly pay increase. Those who don't get the \$400 boost are fourth class postmasters, who receive a 20 per cent raise, and part-time workers, who receive a gain of 20 cents hourly. All the increases are retroactive to January 1, 1946. Approximately 400,000 workers come under the measure. The total cost was estimated at approximately \$160,000,000 yearly. Postal workers received a \$400 yearly increase July 1, 1945. Supporters of the newly signed legislation said, however, that it was required to make up for added living costs and a reduction since last July in the number of hours worked by most employees. The cut in hours eliminated overtime pay received by many.
