

# Demo Write-In Vote Goes To Cook; Official Vote In

Write-in votes by democrats in last Friday's primary gave Republican Troy Cook the edge over Republican Rose Poole for democratic nomination for the legislature.

Mrs. Poole and Cook were both nominated by republicans, and Henry Semon, the filed candidate, received one democratic nomination. Cook got the other democratic nomination by the write-in method. He received 48 votes by democrats, to 32 for Mrs. Poole.

This offshoot of the election does not change the candidates for the fall contest. Henry Semon, Troy Cook and Mrs. Poole will be on the ballot then, running for the two legislative seats. On the republican ticket at Friday's primary, Mrs. Poole received 1866 votes to 1417 for Cook. Two were to be nominated. The write-in results were known when official vote tabulation was completed today.

**Surveyor Write-in**  
A similar situation exists in the balloting for county surveyor. Frank Howard received

the republican bid over Wally Hector, 1389 to 1113, but on the democratic ballot Hector received 152 write-in votes and Howard only 79.

However, Hector cannot accept the democratic nomination and run against Howard in the general election because when he filed his candidacy as a republican he signed the routine agreement that if he was not nominated in the primary he would accept no other party's candidacy.

The final vote tabulation changed none of the standings originally announced in unofficial counts. In the circuit judge race David R. Vandenberg received 3034 votes and Clarence A. Humble 1933. Vandenberg carried 62 precincts, Humble 12. Shevlin was tied at 23 for each candidate and Yamsay had zero for each.

Write-in votes for judge gave J. A. Mahoney three, Orth Sisto more one and Sammy Gordon one.
