

Old Cemetery Is Renovated

MT. LAKE, May 25—The old Mt. Lake cemetery, one of the oldest in Klamath county, is being renovated.

The cemetery consists of five acres originally purchased from E. B. Manning and her husband, J. W. Manning, in January, 1909. It is located about one and one-half miles west of the Merrill highway on the crossroad near Mac's general store.

The committee elected in December, 1908, to organize the cemetery board, included J. G. Stevenson, chairman; S. B. Low, trustee, and R. C. Short, secretary and treasurer. Stevenson was the father of George Stevenson, now living at Olene.

It was known at that time as the Fairview cemetery until March 9, 1935, when it was taken over by the Henley grange, No. 708, and renamed the Mt. Lake cemetery. In March, 1941, a well was drilled on the grounds and in March, 1946, a pump house was built and 900 feet of pipe line laid to reach all occupied territory. The pump, which has been purchased, will be installed as soon as electricity is available. The work is being financed by donations from people of the community and those owning lots.

Contributions are still acceptable as plans are under way to build a caretaker's cottage in the near future.

Members of the committee in charge are Henry Semon, president; Ralph Hill, vice president; Sam Enman, secretary-treasurer; Earl Mack and Jay Fairclough, trustees.

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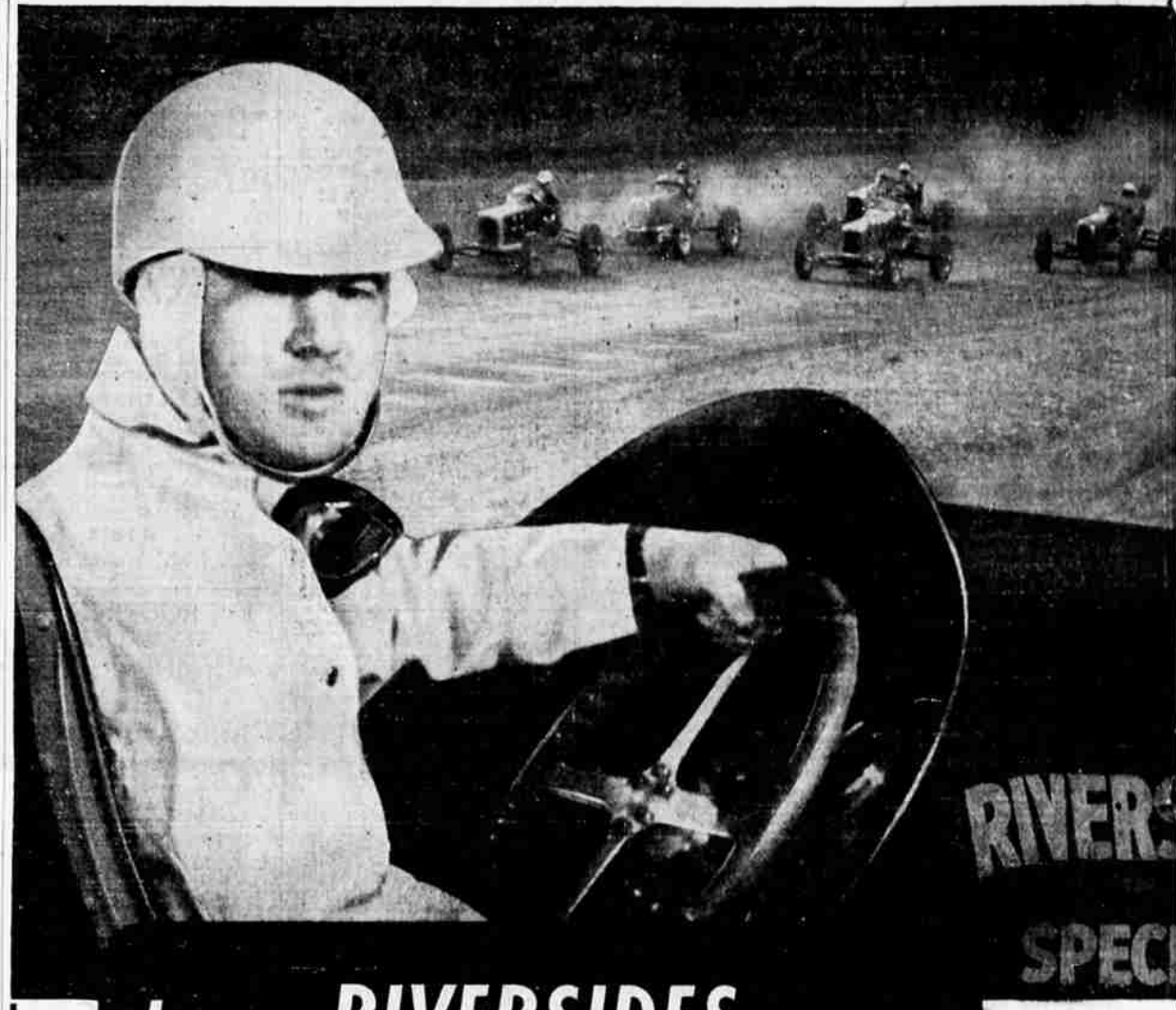
