

Methodists Plan 10-Day Bible Class

Faculty members for the ten-day daily vacation church school which opens on Monday, May 27, are being announced by the First Methodist church, 10th and High streets.

Mrs. Patricia Hunt will be in charge of the music period for the entire school. A junior-intermediate choir which will be featured in the concluding program of the school is one of the projects for Mrs. Hunt's department.

The four and five-year-olds under the direction of Miss Hoagland will "become better acquainted with the infinite and eternal elements in an otherwise changing world through a study of 'The World About Us,'" according to the Sunday school superintendent.

Teachers in the primary department include Mrs. Paul Lee and Mrs. Cy Baker. A unit titled "Outdoors in Palestine" will be used with the six-year-old group, while the seven-year-olds will find their unit called "They Help Along With Me."

Mrs. Mark Taylor will direct the study of the Junior girls toward an appreciation and knowledge of the forms and methods of worship in a study of the text, "Praise Ye the Lord." The junior boys will find a more complete knowledge of the background and founders of the Methodist church, the return for two weeks of work, spent on "The Story and Work of the Methodist Church."

Intermediate boys and girls will explore the Bible and books designed to further appreciation of it; commentaries, dictionaries, atlases, hymnals, and others, under Mrs. Earl Redman's guidance. Supervised recreation, worship and related art projects will also contribute to the effectiveness of the program carefully outlined by these workers at a meeting held Thursday evening at the church.

Parents are requested to cooperate in having their children present at 9 a. m. on Monday, and daily throughout the session, with the exception of Memorial Day when the school will be dismissed for the day. Sessions will end at 11:45 a. m.

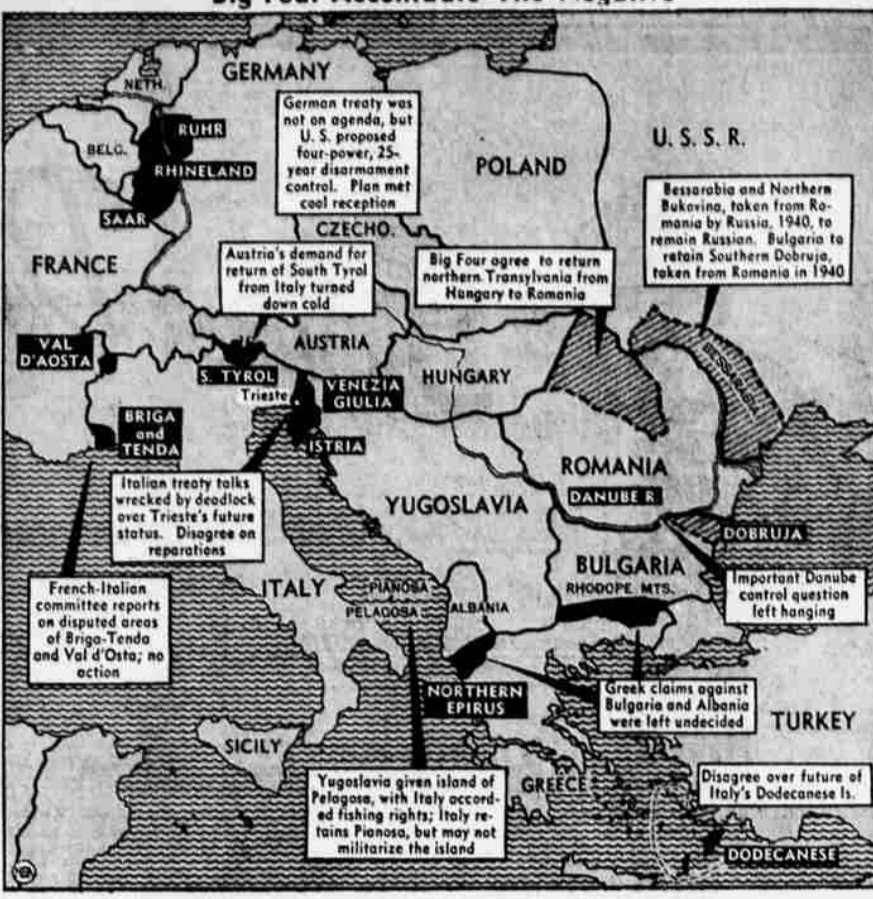

His subject for 3 p. m. when he will deliver a Bible lecture at a mass meeting at the church is, "Red Russia, Communism, and Modernism." At the evening service which begins at 8:00 p. m. he will give his life story. "From Prison Bars to Shining Stars." Mr. Paskell has written a book by this title giving the details of his life, imprisonment, conversion and release.
