## Dubel Speaks To Rotarians

"Japan was licked—mentally, morally and physically—before the atom bombs were dropped," was the opinion expressed by Col. "Jack" Dubel, former commanding officer of the Marine Barracks, to the Rotary club Friday.

Col. Dubel, speaking of his experiences during his tour of duty with occupation forces in Japan, said that at the time his division landed in Japan, Sept. 22, the Jap civilian population "had nothing."

Effects of the atom bomb at Nagasaki also were described. An area, three miles in radius, directly under the bomb explosion was completely devastated, the colonel said. He described this area as being as bare as a floor, with the ground appearing as red clay.

Col. Dubel later spent two months in New Zealand on the auditing survey board on lend-lease operations. The U. S. lend-leased 265 million dollars to New Zealand and received 245 million from New Zealand in reverse lend-lease, he reported.
