

Bride Ship Baby Death Quiz Asked

NEW YORK, May 27 (AP)—As the number of GI babies to die in the past week rose to nine, a U. S. representative called on the war department today for "full information" on conditions aboard the bride ship where the infants became ill.

In Washington, Rep. Jackson (D-Wash.) said he would ask the department about the deaths, and "if I am not satisfied, I will ask the house military affairs committee to call war department officials before it and make a complete investigation."

He said he had been asked by Clarence Lervick, of Hartford, Wash., father on one of the infants who died, for an investigation into the responsibility for the deaths.

Latest fatalities were two-month-old Alvin Harris, son of Mr. and Mrs. Alvin H. Harris of Fulton, N. Y., and ten-month-old Vinita Carter, daughter of Capt. and Mrs. H. S. Carter of Wallington, Tex.

The Harris boy died in a hospital in Fulton Saturday and the Carter girl in Fort Hamilton, Brooklyn, last night.

An army medical board diagnosed the illness of four of the victims at Fort Hamilton as "summer diarrhea."

Meanwhile, eight other babies were admitted to the Fort Hamilton hospital yesterday as "a precautionary measure" suffering from what army authorities said was "mild malnutrition."

They arrived aboard the George Goethals.

Saturday, one adult and 26 babies from the President Tyler were admitted suffering from diarrhea and possible respiratory infections.

Truman Talks Win Applause

WASHINGTON, May 27 (AP) White House Secretary Charles G. Ross said today that telegraphic response to President Truman's railroad strike speeches was the greatest following a presidential action in memory of executive aides. He said it was "overwhelmingly" favorable.

Ross told a news conference that Jules Rodier, in charge of the telegraph room, had "never seen anything like it since he came to the White House August 1, 1900."

Ross said more than 7000 telegrams had been received since Mr. Truman's Friday night radio speech.

The telegrams, Ross told a news conference, are still coming in, and letters are beginning to arrive.

He said the telephone switchboard was swamped with calls both after the Friday night speech and after the president's address to congress Saturday.

Asked if there were responses also from union organizations, he replied there were "quite a number."

Mexican Workers Reach Tulelake

TULELAKE, May 27—The first Mexican nationals to arrive here for farm work came in last weekend under sponsorship of the Tulelake Growers.

Thirty-six workers arrived, and are being housed temporarily in the vacated army barracks at Camp Tulelake. Sixty more are expected in a few days.




