

# Senator Carter Glass, Federal Reserve Bank Founder, Passes At 88

WASHINGTON, May 28 (AP)—Senator Carter Glass of Virginia, a long-time member of congress, "father of the federal reserve system" and once a cabinet member, died early today of heart failure.

The oldest member of the senate, he was 88 last January 4. Death came in his apartment at the Mayflower hotel, where he lived with his second wife, Mary.

Flags on the capitol were lowered to half-staff.

Glass had been so ill that he was unable to appear in the senate since June, 1942. Because of this a Virginia republican sought unsuccessfully last year to have his seat declared vacant and a special election called to name a successor. Virginia courts threw the suit out and the supreme court declined to review the case.

After winning election nine

times as a member of the house, Glass resigned in 1918 to become President Wilson's secretary of the treasury.

He left the cabinet in 1920 to accept appointment as senator and was re-elected five times, most recently to a term expiring in 1949.

Declined Roosevelt Offer  
President Roosevelt offered to make him secretary of the treasury again in 1933, but Glass declined. It was generally known that the failure of the president-elect to give what the Virginian would regard as satisfactory assurance of a "sound-money" policy on the part of the forthcoming new deal administration.

Glass received much of the credit for creation of the federal reserve system because of his part in drafting the federal reserve law when he was chairman of the house committee on banking and currency in 1913. He was bitterly displeased when Roosevelt abandoned the gold standard. He also broke with the administration over the NRA, crop reduction, spending, and the 1937 supreme court reorganization plan.

Nevertheless Roosevelt, who fondly called him "an unconquered rebel," remained his personal friend.

Mrs. Aurelia Glass died in 1937. The senator married Mrs. Mary Scott Meade of Amherst, Va., a widow many years his junior, in 1940.

His son, Powell, newspaper executive of Lynchburg, Va., died last July.

Another son, Carter Glass Jr., is editor of the Lynchburg Advance and recently was released

# New Short Cut For Tulelake

Steps toward immediate construction of the proposed new short cut road from Dorris to Tulelake, were taken Friday at Yreka, Calif., by the board of supervisors. A special session was called to approve the low bid received by the division of highways and to recommend award of the contract. Name of the low bidder was not announced.

The short cut will be located near the state line from Cal-Ore to four miles west of Hatfield and will be under supervision of the state and constructed with the aid of federal and state funds.

Estimated cost of the short cut was \$488,262.94. Low bid offered totaled \$577,703.50, but F. W. Hazelwood, state highway district engineer, advised that construction costs had gone up since the estimate was originally made and that it was his opinion that a lower bid would not be received should the state advertise again.

It is understood that the low bidder had equipment assembled for shipment to Siskiyou county and has been awaiting word regarding award of the contract. Under California law, county approval of the bids was necessary before the contract could be awarded.

MERRILL, May 28—Stanley Aurum Anderson, 41, prominent Merrill rancher, died following a three-day illness at Hillside hospital in Klamath Falls, Sunday at 12:30 p. m. Mr. Anderson had farmed the old John W. Taylor place north of here for several years and prior to that time had farmed on the state line.

Mr. Anderson was born in Aurum, Nev., and came to Klamath county 18 years ago. He was active in the Merrill IOOF lodge and also the Presbyterian church. Final rites will be held from the First Presbyterian church here, Tuesday at 11 a. m. with the Rev. David J. Ferguson, coming from Mill City, Ore., to officiate. Interment will take place in the family plot, IOOF cemetery, Merrill.

In addition to his wife, Bee, Mr. Anderson is survived by one son, Stanley Malan, who arrived today from San Diego where he is stationed with the U. S. navy, and one daughter, Barbara Joan, his mother, Mrs. Clara M. Rager of Cedar Rapids, Ia., one brother, Berland L.
