

# Conferees Meet In Effort To Avoid Maritime Strike

WASHINGTON, May 29 (AP)—The threatened maritime strike took top billing today in the government's drive to resolve all major disputes.

With a coal settlement seemingly at hand, Secretary of Labor Schwelb called in shipowners and maritime union chiefs for a conference aimed at finding some way to prevent the shipping tieups set for June 15.

That strike, if it comes off, would cripple America's merchant marine, halt shipping from Atlantic, Pacific and Gulf ports and prevent the export of relief supplies for famine areas abroad.

Joseph Curran, president of the CIO National Maritime Union, told reporters on his arrival from New York that he expected the ship operators to make some "new proposals" at the meeting.

"If they don't," Curran said, "it will be a difficult situation. And I mean it."

# Utility Elects Hall Director

Stockholders of the California Oregon Power company, at their annual meeting May 28, in Medford, voted to increase the number of directors of the company from seven to nine, and elected nine directors for the ensuing year. In commenting upon the election of Hall and Jackson, A. S. Cummins, president of the company, said: "Mr. Hall has been a prominent citizen of Klamath Falls for many years. His intimate knowledge of affairs in the Klamath basin will be an important asset in the company's operation. Jackson, vice president in charge of sales, has been with the company for the past 20 years and was a member of the board of directors before entering military service in 1943. Jackson was released from the army in January, 1946. His reelection will add strength and stability to our future determinations."

Henry said the full one-cent boost should be allowed because at the time of the original price freeze, the state milk board had a two cent price boost under consideration.
