The next meeting will be with Kathryn Billings on the Keno highway, and Fannie Goddard will assist.

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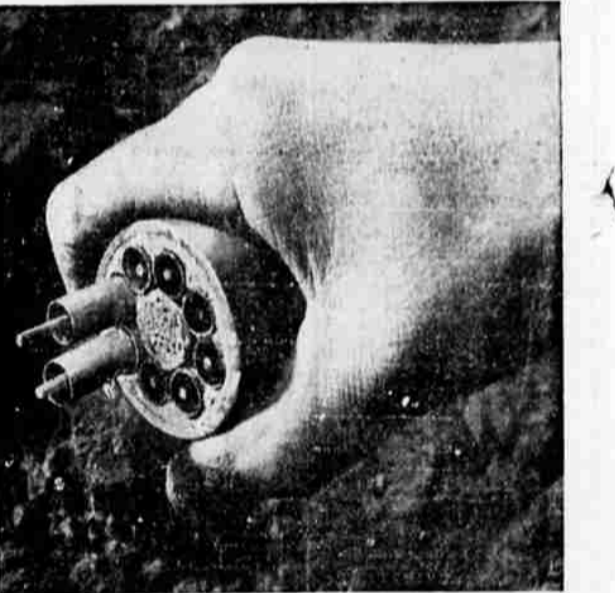
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
