## Superintendent Court Ratifies Timber Switch



Beatrice Greenwalt, RN, superintendent of the Shriners' Hospital for Crippled Children, Portland, will be here this weekend to attend the annual Shrine dance for the hospital fund Saturday at the armory. Miss Greenwalt will speak at 6:45 p. m. Saturday over KFLW. The public is urged to support the dance, all funds to be turned over to the hospital where many children from Klamath county have received treatment over the years.

The county court has approved, but registered a protest over, the transfer of about 5230 acres of timber land owned by the Shevlin-Hixon Lumber company to the U. S. forest service in return for timber lands located in Fremont and Deschutes national forests, all in Klamath county.

This method of transfer cuts the acreage from the county tax rolls and also gets around a provision whereby the county is paid 25 per cent of the value involved of national forest timber sale.

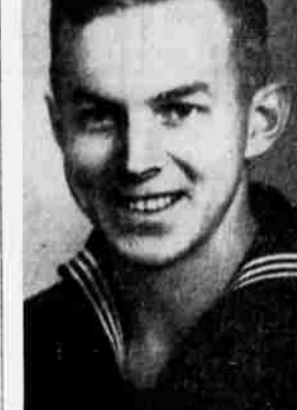
Judge U. E. Reeder said the court granted approval of this transaction because the private lands concerned are in small, separated parcels within the boundaries of the national forests and located so as to make it improbable that any private concern would cut the timber.

In clearing the transfer with forestry officials, Shevlin-Hixon reserves the right to enter the lands and cut merchantable dead timber, lodgepole, ponderosa and sugar pine until December 31, 1950, with the further proviso that if certain conditions prevail, the time limit may be extended for five years.

A time limit for removal of cut logs is set at June 30, 1951.

In a letter to R. W. Crawford, superintendent of Deschutes national forest, the county court approved the transfer but objected to the "procedure of exchanging national forest stumpage for privately owned land and timber" without the

## Holiday Death Toll Mounts To New High

The nation's known death toll of Memorial Day traffic and other accidents mounted to 93 today (Friday), 19 more than for the same holiday last year.

Traffic mishaps claimed the lives of 50, compared with 20 last year. The total was only seven less than the national safety council's pre-holiday estimate of 57 fatalities on the highways. Twenty-five persons drowned and 18 died of miscellaneous accidents.

## Klamath Sailor Declared Dead

Harold William Derrah, yeoman first class, USNR, who served on the ill-fated submarine Kete which failed to return from a war patrol in the vicinity of Nansai Shoto, Japanese enemy waters, was among the Klamath men to whom homage was paid on Memorial Day.

The Klamath War Memorial committee announced with regret today that young Derrah's name was omitted from those on the memorial shaft as official confirmation of his death was not received in time for it to be included on the obelisk.

Derrah was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Derrah, 1343 Crescent. He was first reported missing in action since May 31, 1945, when the USS Kete was due to report at Midway following a war patrol which left Guam earlier. No word has been received as to the fate of the submarine or crew and in a letter to the family signed by James Forrestal, secretary of the navy, Harold was officially declared dead as of April 1, 1946.

## Diesel Engines Sold As Surplus Material

PORTLAND, May 31 (AP)—Fifty-three surplus diesel engine units, built to power General Sherman tanks, have been sold by the Portland war assets administration, it reported today.

One sale, it said, was to Hugh Sherwood Jr., Toledo, who is starting a sawmill and another to C. W. Priest, Vancouver, Wash., to power a fishing boat.

## Klamath Flyer Hurt In Dive

John A. Lambert, 36-year-old employe of the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company here, was nursing an injured nose and multiple bruises in Salem today after he and his sister plummeted into the Willamette river Thursday in a rented Piper Cub plane.

Lambert, who lives at 303 S. 8th, had gone north to spend Memorial Day weekend with his mother, Mrs. Marie Lambert. While there he rented the plane and he and his sister, Mrs. Antoinette Bose of Salem, took off from the Salem airport. Lambert, in a conversation with his wife here today, said he was flying near the river when his plane suddenly struck a 66,000-volt power line, crashed into a pole and then dropped into the water. Neither was badly hurt and following their rescue by a tug, were treated at a Salem hospital and dismissed. Electric service in Salem was halted several minutes following the crash.

The flyer took lessons at both the Salem and Klamath Falls airports. He is employed as transmission man with the telephone company.
