

50 Seniors From KUHS Elect OSC

Fifty of the 1946 Klamath Union high school graduating class of 213 members are planning to go to Oregon State college in Corvallis for fall term, the high school office announced recently.

The University of Oregon at Eugene placed second with 42 students preferring that school, and Lewis and Clark at Portland had five listing it as their preference.

Willamette university at Salem and the Southern Oregon College of Education, a normal school at Ashland for students planning teaching careers took four preferences.

Other schools had 14 KUHS graduates desiring to attend. Out-of-state schools were preferred by nine of these students, four want to attend California schools, and one is a scholarship to Whitman college in Washington received by Alyce Wells.

Roger Vanderhoff and Charles Thurman, both of the Pelican football squad last season, listed Notre Dame as their preference in colleges.

Housing Lack Hurts Logging

PORTLAND, June 10 (AP)—A housing shortage in upstate cities and logging areas hampers employment progress in the state, Lee C. Stoll, state U. S. employment service director, reported.

Unemployment in Oregon was 61,000 on May 1, of which 70 per cent was in the Portland area, Stoll reported. He said shipyards had been laying off workers at a rate of 1500 a month in recent months and that the industry's payroll was down to 10,578 compared to 90,000 at the wartime peak.

Stoll said he had notified Washington that the housing-caused "bottleneck" in employment in logging and lumber areas would prevent a 25 per cent boost in Oregon's lumber production asked by National Housing Expediter Wilson Wyatt.

He reported lack of skilled personnel and transportation, also the job turnover, was hampering lumber production.

Industrialist Killed At Desk

BOSTON, June 10 (AP)—William A. Whitcomb, 73, president of the Great Northern Paper company, was shot to death in his office in the heart of the city today, and police termed an unsigned contract found on his desk a possible clue to the identity of his well-dressed slayer.

"I have a hunch who might have done it," said Lieutenant Harold Watkins. "This contract would have been very beneficial to a certain party if Whitcomb had signed it."

Whitcomb, a native of Clinton, Ind., was slain only seconds after Sally Whitcomb, his secretary, admitted the killer to his private office and left the two men alone. His body was found face down on the floor and four discharged 32-caliber cartridges were nearby.

Miss Whitcomb remembered the slayer as a man who came to the office last week, representing himself as a treasury department agent.

Although the slayer strolled unchallenged out of the Great Northern company's eighth floor offices, where some 20 employees sat at their desks, and apparently left the building by an elevator, police thought he might have remained in the nine-story structure.

They threw a cordon about the building and, with Miss Whitcomb, scanned all who attempted to enter or leave.

Police described the slayer as between 45 and 50 years old, of stocky build. They said he wore a straw hat and carried a brief case.
