

Snell Lauds State Labor Relations

ASTORIA, June 12 (AP)—The excellent Oregon record of employer-worker relations during the war was praised by Governor Earl Snell in an address to the Oregon Federation of Labor convention here.

Governor Snell reviewed the work of the state accident and unemployment commissions in his address yesterday and declared the cooperation of union leadership made it possible for the state to improve services during the war years despite accelerated industrial activity.

Secretary of State Robert Farrell Jr. told the group the state planned to announce the start of the \$10,000,000 state institution building program soon.

He said the institutions, with 8000 inmates and patients, are overcrowded.

Resolutions adopted yesterday urged amendment of the state unemployment compensation law to authorize maximum 325 weekly benefits for 26 weeks in one year and for benefits to begin immediately instead of a week after loss of employment.

Sen. Wayne L. Morse (R-Ore.) was complimented in the annual report of Federation Executive Secretary J. T. Marr who said the senator's work indicated his "understanding of the issues involved in labor disputes."

The convention also approved resolutions endorsing the state school support fund of \$50 for each child and urged legislation requiring employers to accept the workmen's compensation act when a majority of employes request its protection.
