

Colorful Career Ends For Cyclone Thompson In Automobile Wreck

NEW PINE CREEK, June 13 (AP)—Word was received by relatives last Monday morning that Cyclone Thompson, age 63, a colorful character in the early history of New Pine Creek, was instantly killed in an automobile crash near Herlong or Susanville, Calif., last Sunday night. Full particulars were not learned here Tuesday.

Thompson, who always wore a long flowing mustache, drove the first stage coach from Fort Bidwell to New Pine Creek via the High Grade route back in 1912 when the latter was a thriving mining camp of several hundred people. He also drove many a freight team, being an expert teamster and a typical westerner.

Cyclone, although being an advocate of the western policy of minding one's own business, was rough and ready, had nerves of steel and never ran away from trouble. He there-

fore figured in many exciting experiences in the boom days of this locality.

He was born in Neacho, Mo., March 12, 1884, and was raised in Gibsonville, Ida., in the mining country. Later he moved to Burns, Ore., at the age of 17 with his mother. He was engaged for a number of years as a hide buyer.

In 1908 he married Goldie Bailey at Vale, Ore. To this union was born three children, two boys, Walter G. and George Wade, who live in New Pine Creek, and one daughter, Juanita Hardisty, residing in Herlong. Other survivors are his mother, Mrs. Sula Thompson, 91, of Ontario, Ore.; a sister, Mrs. Frank Zeller, also of Ontario, and five grandchildren.

The burial place has not yet been ascertained but it is presumed he will be buried at Ontario, Ore., with funeral services held here. Deceased had been working at Herlong for the past several months and was a visitor here in the early spring. His two sons left immediately upon receiving word of the tragedy for Susanville to assist in making funeral arrangements.

Logger Strike At Standstill

VICTORIA, B. C., June 13 (AP)—Harold Pritchett, district president of the International Woodworkers of America (IOWA) asserted that operators have refused to negotiate further with the striking loggers and sawmill workers, even at the request of Chief Justice Gordon Sloan, government-appointed arbitrator.

Pritchett added: "In refusing to negotiate the employers reject collective bargaining and must accept full responsibility for the continuance of the dispute."

The statement was made last night after a conference of Pritchett, Karley Larson of Portland, Ore., international union representative, and Justice Sloan.

Meanwhile, at Vancouver B. C., R. V. Stuart, spokesman

for the British Columbia lumber operators announced that the employers still are prepared to accept without reservation the recommendations of Justice Sloan.

Stuart criticized Pritchett's failure to accept Sloan's previous proposal of a 15-cent an hour increase in wages, a 40-hour week and the voluntary checkoff system for dues, and remarked "acceptance of Sloan's award would start the wheels turning again within 24 hours."

Park Opening On 15th Seen

Present indications are that Crater Lake park will open on schedule this Saturday, according to park authorities.

The exact time that park gates will open will be announced tomorrow. Visitors are cautioned to drive slowly and carefully over park roads.

No camp grounds will be open until later, but the park lodge will open on Saturday.

Snow plows have been working 16 hours daily to get the roads in condition by June 15. The state has loaned a plow and an operator to assist in the road clearing operations.

Thomas C. Parker, assistant park superintendent, stated that the Medford road to Crater Lake from Annie Springs to Union creek will also be open Saturday.
