

Potato Outlook Excellent As Basin Crops Grow Well

Potato plants are springing out of the ground on some 20,000 acres of the Klamath basin. Farmers report the condition of potato growth is generally good, and the outlook at this stage excellent. The plantings are believed to be down some 8 to 10 per cent under last year.

when the farmers of the Klamath basin seeded a record of more than 28,000 acres of spuds. Grain is coming along fine throughout the basin, especially in irrigation areas. Dry land grain is rated as good in spots, but generally only "fair."

No Harm Seen In Mosquitoes

PORTLAND, June 13 (AP)—Mosquitoes, ranging through Portland in vast swarms, may be annoying but they carry no threat of malaria despite presence of many ex-servicemen with malaria parasites in their blood, Dr. Harold M. Erickson said today.

The Portland mosquitoes are of the culex variety—non-carriers of malaria—the state health officer pointed out. However, in low-lying areas of the Willamette valley a few anopheles mosquitoes—which do carry the disease—have been found, he said.

Federal and state health authorities plan control programs to stamp out breeding grounds in the vicinity of upstate flood control projects, Dr. Erickson said.

State Will Inspect All Pasteurization

SALEM, June 13 (AP)—The state department of agriculture today announced it would begin immediate inspection of all pasteurization plants in Oregon to determine compliance with rules and regulations for the pasteurization of milk.

The department also announced that in August it would begin to hold a series of examinations for licensing pasteurizer operators.

Stored Wheat Quota Will Be Marketed

Farmers storing 1946 wheat in elevators and warehouses will be required to sell one-half of all wheat delivered for movement into trade channels. Also, one-half of all the wheat bought by elevators and other commercial operators must be set aside for sale to the Commodity Credit Corporation. The program will remain in effect until the government has enough wheat from the 1946 crop to cover the 250 million bushel requirement for export to famine-stricken countries. The wheat sales order is in effect in all states north of the Ohio river and west of the Mississippi river, except Wisconsin and Arizona, and in Maryland, Pennsylvania and New York. If producers fail to obtain prices substantially at ceiling from the elevators, the order authorizes direct sale to Commodity Credit corporation.

Timber Needs Jump Bidding

PORTLAND, June 13 (AP)—The demand for merchantable timber resulted in the most competitive bidding on record for 33 tracts offered by the Oregon-California land office, an official said today. Prospective buyers submitted 57 bids totalling \$420,456 for the 85,623,000 board feet for which bids were opened yesterday. O & C lands administrator, W. H. Horning reported. Contracts for 23 of the tracts were awarded, but 10 were held up because of close bidding, he said. Horning announced 60,535,000 board feet of timber having appraised value of \$274,509 will be sold July 9 from other tracts in the western Oregon area.

Farm Group Discusses CVA Plans

"History shows what happened to the peasants of Europe who lacked organization," said Rory Collins of the Oregon state board of agriculture to members of the Klamath County Farm bureau at a recent meeting held in the Henley grange hall. "Only through organized effort can farmers maintain equality with industry and labor," he warned, and advised farmers to organize with the Farm Bureau Federation as "it is fighting for agriculture on all fronts on problems of transportation, taxation, tariffs, monetary matters, efficient production and distribution."

Collins is a successful orchardist of the Hood River valley who prides himself on being a dirt farmer with his hands in the soil, his feet on the ground and who still milks his cow on the right.

The Columbia valley authority bill before congress was the main subject for discussion with Edwin W. Lage, president of the Oregon Reclamation Congress, presenting arguments against the bill. Lage stated that power over this entire region would be placed in the hands of only three men appointed by the president of the United States for nine years and that this would be too great a concentration of power. "We can legislate against private monopolies," he said, "but not against government monopoly."

A. M. Thomas, secretary of the Enterprise Irrigation district, spoke in favor of the bill, saying that he believed it did protect the irrigation rights of Klamath farmers and that if the three men were located in the Columbia valley region there would be less of the remote political control over our resources and the lack of understanding of local problems that now obtains under the reclamation service.

Hay driers, dehydrators for alfalfa meal, milk driers, farm refrigeration, the heating of homes—all with electricity, were discussed by Lacey M. Peoples who is utilization specialist for the Bonneville administration.

50 Portland Teachers Quit

PORTLAND, June 13 (AP)—Resignations of 50 Portland district school teachers were accepted last night by the board of education, the largest number leaving the system at any one time.

Dr. Willard B. Spalding, superintendent, said 14 were retiring, but that uncertainty of the school's fiscal budget had undoubtedly led many of the instructors to seek employment elsewhere.

The city schools expect a budget deficit of \$1,500,000 which would force curtailment of many special studies and the athletic program unless congress approves extension of Latham act funds.

The board accepted an athletics-financing plan submitted by the High School Dads' club calling for increased admission prices and changes in organization.
