## Portland Bank Plans New Trust Division In Southern Oregon

Tracy H. Crum, assistant trust officer of the First National bank of Portland, has been assigned by Carlos C. Close, vice president and trust officer to head the new southern Oregon division of the trust department. Crum has set up his residence in Medford and will divide his time between First National's six southern Oregon branch offices.

The expansion has been contemplated for several years by the bank management, but the armed forces took away nine highly trained staff members, delaying the move. A large part of the work assumed by Crum during the war now has been picked up by returning servicemen, releasing him for the important southern Oregon assignment.

## Kaiser Said To Want Increased Capacity

PORTLAND, Ore., June 15 (AP)—Interior Secretary Julius A. Krug reported here that Henry J. Kaiser wants to increase the capacity of the Spokane, Wash., aluminum reduction plant.

The industrialist, who took over the plant recently, hopes to add two potlines, from government plants being dismantled, to the four already at Spokane, Krug said.

"The problem," he said, "is one for the Bonneville administration to determine whether it wants to devote that much of its power to the production of aluminum. It would like to have some power left for other industries."
