Inflated Prices Threaten Aged Drawing Relief Funds

Talk of junking the OPA and threatened inflation must strike close to home for approximately 260 persons over the age of 65 in Klamath county who are having to live on fixed individual incomes of about \$50 a month.

They are the old people cared for by the county welfare office, and represent 14 per cent of the total number of persons over 65 in the county.

An average monthly budget for these persons shows an income of about \$50 from all sources, social security, local relief, gifts and the like, and the \$50 is chopped up into expenditures such as the following, in round figures:

Food, \$20; housing, \$10; clothing, \$5; \$7 for utilities and heat; \$3 for medicine and other necessities and \$5 for spending money.

These amounts vary with personal needs, and medical attention is provided over and above the monthly grant given by the welfare office, but this average is an assured income on which the persons are just expected to live in some comfort.

Item by item, the county welfare office sets up a budget consistent with the actual living costs of the individual being cared for and arrives at the amount of money to be granted him each month.

The grants in Klamath county average \$37 a month from

the local relief agency. Social security payments and other sources of small income bring the per case income average to \$50.

Klamath county's old age benefit program is operated at a relatively low cost in that this county has fewer dependent old people in accordance with population than most counties in the state. Klamath's average is 133 persons drawing old age assistance in each 1000 persons over 65, while the state average is 223. Average cost of the old age program in the state is \$1.19 per capita, in Klamath county the cost is 41 cents per capita.

The grants made by the local welfare office are just as liberal as any in the state, but the cost as a whole is lower because of fewer dependent old people.

There has been an increase recently in the number of applications here for relief, principally because some of the older persons who worked dur-

ing the war years have finished their period of drawing unemployment compensation and their social security is not enough to live on.

Approximately 4000 products are made from coal tar. These products include perfume and aspirin.
