

Fear Moves Russia Says YMCA Man

PORTLAND, June 21 (AP) — The goal emphasized in all Russian literature is not world conquest, but a standard of living equal to or better than that of the United States, the northwest institute of international relations was told.

Bert G. Mitchell of Washington Technical institute, who spent six years in Russia as YMCA organizer, said fear rather than aggression is behind Russia's actions. That nation feels the Anglo-Saxon countries are "ganging up" on her, he declared.

A former German reichstag member, Dr. William F. Sollman, said all of Europe was being harmed by the division of Germany into occupation zones and efforts to make it an agricultural nation. He proposed that industry be restored to Germany under allied control and that an allied police force replace the occupation armies.

Sollman also recommended: A constitution renouncing war and armament; permanent neutrality backed by international law; use of German youth to rebuild invaded countries; a loose German federation; Europeanization of the Ruhr; and establishment of cooperatives.

WAA To Sell From Portland

WASHINGTON, June 21 (AP) The war assets administration notified Rep. Norblad (R-Ore.) today that all surplus consumer goods within Oregon hereafter will be sold through the Portland regional office.

Norblad complained that school districts in his state were having difficulty in obtaining surplus consumer goods and asked that the WAA act to aid them.

The WAA said that effort was being made to give priority purchasers sufficient notice of contemplated sales so they would have ample time to inspect and purchase surplus property. It said it also would expedite notice to purchasers as to whether their orders can be accepted in full or in part.

"The establishment of the proposed site sales program will give Oregon state agencies and citizens an early opportunity to avail themselves of surpluses in the order of their statutory priority rights," the WAA said.

"Under this program, surplus property in various installations and depots will be offered for inspection and purchase on the site."

The following sales have been scheduled, WAA said, and others will follow quickly as they can be arranged:

Transportation corporation open storage yard, Longview, Wash., July 29; Oceanic terminal, Portland, Ore., August 5; Navy building, Portland, August 10; Camp Adams, Corvallis, Ore., August 26; Unanilla ordinance depot, Ore., September 2; Veterans Automotive, Portland, continuing since April 24 and Camp Abbott, Ore., August 26.

Air Research Plant In View

WASHINGTON, June 21 (AP) Plans for construction of a supersonic research center in the Pacific northwest probably will not be completed until late summer, the national advisory committee for aeronautics has informed Rep. Horan (R-Wash.).

J. F. Victory, executive secretary of the committee, told Horan in a letter it would be at least that long before the plan will be ready for presentation to congress.

He said a special committee is studying the program for further research in order to propose to congress a "sound, unified and thoroughly defensible plan for needed supersonic facilities."

The army air corps said in a recent report it had drawn preliminary plans for a supersonic research center which would cost half a billion dollars and require huge acreage, large amounts of electric power and water to operate five large wind tunnels.

Horan previously announced the committee had sent engineers to the Pacific Northwest to investigate various sites for the research laboratory the committee is planning.

Gen. Halsey To Leave For Duties In Japan

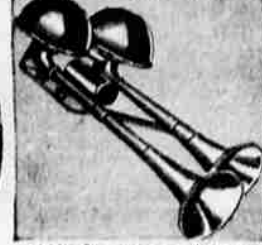
