

# Oregon Fiscal Policy Rapped

PORTLAND, June 27 (AP)—Failure of the state legislature to provide adequate funds have made Oregon's public institutions "a disgrace to the state," John H. Hall, state representative since 1921, told the Oregon Republican club here.

Hall blamed "niggardly" appropriations and warned that the state's police organization may break up unless the 1947 legislature increases salaries, now at a \$200 a month maximum.

"The boys are just hanging on to see what action the legislature takes. If the legislature fails to make a decent and adequate appropriation, we won't have any state police," he said yesterday.

The representative condemned the state for refunding taxpay-

ers \$21,000,000 in income tax surplus which he said "they didn't need and which could have been used to meet state needs."

# Starch Plant OK'ed By CPA

PORTLAND, June 27 (AP)—The Northwest Chemurgy Co-op Inc., The Dalles, had a green light from the civilian production administration today to build its \$300,000 plant to make starch and glucose from wheat and potatoes.

The CPA approved \$439,365 of applications and turned down \$393,209. Rejections included: Western Meenonite school, \$40,000 high school, Wheatland; Ray W. Archer and E. D. Heyler, \$22,000 poultry building, Albany; Springfield Veterans' association, \$20,000 meeting hall, Springfield; Mrs. Clara S. Burnham, \$20,000 store, Umatilla; H. E. Rohland, \$11,741 store, Salem; Leonard D. Olson, \$6500 cleaning plant, Hermiston; L. H. Wojcik, \$9,000 garage, Springfield; Vida Marie Bigham, \$38,000 garage, Springfield.

# Prohibitionists Pick Bartender Candidate

SAN DIEGO, Calif., June 27 (AP)—John W. Brown, secretary of the local and state bartenders union (AFL) was chosen by prohibitionist party voters at the June 4 primary for a place on the party's county central committee, the official canvas disclosed.

"I feel highly complimented," said Brown, "even if I can't serve." He explained, as did Rex Lord, registrar of voters, that he was ineligible because he was not a registered prohibitionist. The voters favoring him wrote in his name on the ballot.

# German Prisoners Work Beet Crops

CORVALLIS, June 27 (AP)—German prisoners of war working on Malheur county beet crops added \$130,184.40 to the U. S. treasury in six weeks of labor, the Oregon extension service reported today.

J. R. Beck, state supervisor of the emergency farm labor program, said a maximum of 693 prisoners blocked and thinned or hoed 13,325 acres of the 22,000 acre total of sugar beets in the area for some 300 farmers. The growers paid prevailing wages to the treasury for the 28,957 man-days of prisoner labor. The prisoners kept 80 cents a day, most of which was spent for canteen items. They earned a total of 323,165 on this basis, he said.

The work from May 1 to June 15 was halted when the war department ordered the prisoners returned to Germany from the Nyssa camp.
