

# Maritime Men Complete World Wage-Hour Slate

SEATTLE, June 28 (AP)—The wage and hour committee of the world maritime conference finished its work early this morning on an international convention calling for a minimum wage of \$44 a month for seamen, an eight-hour day on distant trade ships and a modified form of the eight-hour day on near-trade ships.

In contrast to their previous night's heated session, the committee got through its final meeting with but a few brief skirmishes and adjourned at 1:30 a. m.

The draft of the proposed convention was sent to the conference drafting committee for preparation for submission later today to the full conference session for its action.
