

Joint Camp Planned For Girl Groups

A survey of the Girl Scout camp at Lake o' the Woods was made Monday by Harriet Vernon, Girl Scout regional camp advisor, who was in Klamath Falls the early part of the week. Her survey of Camp Esther Applegate was followed by a meeting at the chamber of commerce of the Girl Scouts and Camp Fire Girls organizations.

Miss Vernon explained the requirements for a camp suitable for girls of the two organizations who share the site. She gave a detailed description of the unit type of camping as recommended in the national minimum standards for these camps. She also made practical suggestions as to how a five-year building plan might be financed and carried out.

John Sarginson of the United States national forest service spoke on how his organization might best help with the building of such a camp. Since any plans drawn up must be approved by the national forestry service, he had a number of suggestions to offer.

Bill Canton has made a topographical map of Camp Esther Applegate, which is the first step toward the five-year building plan under way. At present the only structure is a lodge which is used as a dining room. It also serves as a recreational hall in time of bad weather.

The joint camp site development committee is composed of Mrs. J. V. Owens, Florence McConahey, O. C. Rice, Mr. and Mrs. L. F. Carter, all of whom represent the Girl Scouts; representatives of Camp Fire Girls are Mr. and Mrs. C. H. Bremer, B. C. Johnston and A. J. McDonald. Ed Livingston is general chairman.

PORTLAND, June 28 (AP)—An emergency ordinance setting gross-revenue license fees of 2 and 3 per cent on seven utilities was in effect here today, unanimously approved by the city council.

Dorothy McCullough Lee, author of the measure, estimated it would bring Portland's coffers \$450,000 this coming fiscal year.

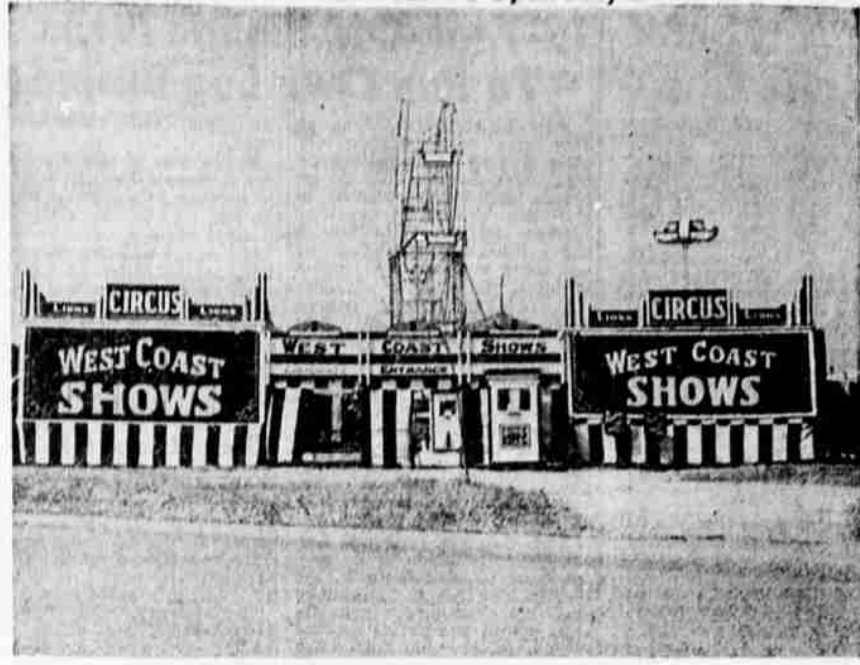

War Profits To Be Probed

WASHINGTON, June 28 (AP)—Chairman Mead (D-N.Y.) told the senate today the defense investigating committee will begin a public investigation of war profits Monday with hearings on the operations of a group of Chicago concerns.

Declaring that more than \$315,000,000 had been spent on war purchases up to V-J day, Mead said it was "perfectly obvious that there would be some wasteful and improper practices and some instances of downright fraudulent and criminal practices" because of the need for haste.

The committee hopes to determine, he said, "the manner in which government officials have policed and supervised the expenditure of substantial sums of public funds in war procurement."

Storm Signals Fly On Coast

SAN FRANCISCO, June 28 (AP)—The weather bureau at 6:45 a. m. today ordered storm warnings hoisted along the coast from Cape Mendocino, just south of Eureka, Calif., to Newport, Ore., two-thirds of the way up the Oregon seaboard.

The weather bureau said "a disturbance of moderate intensity is central about 300 miles west of Newport and will move eastward, causing fresh to strong southerly winds shifting to strong southwest, on the Oregon and extreme northern California coasts this afternoon and tonight."

Father Vague On Tot Deaths

REDWOOD CITY, Calif., June 28 (AP)—A district attorney's investigator said today that 24-year-old Vorhees James Newton, accused of slaying his two baby daughters and leaving their battered bodies in a wooded canyon, told officers questioning him he could not remember but he "must have" killed the children.

Frank Marlowe, chief district attorney's investigator of San Mateo county, said Newton broke under the strain of 24 hours of questioning and that the authorities had established a possible motive in the double slaying and the attack on Newton's 21-year-old wife, Lorraine.

Questioning revealed, he said, that the couple had a bitter quarrel over whether she should have an abortion. Marlowe said they quarreled during a family automobile ride Monday. Mrs. Newton, found next day dazed and with a fractured skull shortly before the bodies were discovered, is still in critical condition.

"We discussed my wife's pregnancy. I didn't want her to have an abortion, and we argued over this."

For nearly a day after he was taken into custody, Newton, facing a charge of murdering 2-year-old Barbara Anne and 7-month-old Caroline Lee and attempting to murder his wife, had maintained his memory "blacked out."
