FORT LEWIS, July 5 (AP) — Homeward bound by way of Camp Shanks, N. Y., and national labor camps overseas, 332 German prisoners of war, last of a contingent once numbering 10,000 here, carried with them today thoughts of the American way of life.

Maj. Frank Jacobs, commanding officer of the camp, said many have asked permission to remain in this country. This can be done only after they return to Germany, by seeking legal entry through immigration channels.
