

# Antelope Order Vanguard Reaches Blue Sky Hotel

 BLUE SKY HOTEL (Lake County) July 11, (Special to The Herald and News) — Today a few of us who constitute the vanguard of the Order of the Antelope—the guys who help get the annual convention headquarters under way—are camped among the yellow pines on the foothills of Hart Mt. We've pitched our bedrolls in the thicket where Captain Warner and his men camped long before the turn of the century. Cold spring water runs down through the yellow pines, the only grove of its kind on the 27,000 acres of refuge land. A few hundred feet to the east are the last remaining landmarks of the Warner expedition—scattered fireplaces dotting the hillsides and the valley.

# Buyers Strike On Food Items

PORTLAND, July 11 (AP) — Shoppers are refusing to buy many food items that have risen in price, H. E. Carlson, secretary of the Oregon Independent Retail Grocers' and Meat Dealers' association, reported today.

"There has been a very noticeable drop off in buying in the items on which the prices have been raised," he said.

Meat sales are "below those of rationing days" and butter at 78 cents and higher a pound has not been selling.

There were hints in prices bid at the North Portland livestock market that retail prices of some meat cuts may go higher. Choice barrows and gilt hogs sold yesterday for \$19.50, highest since September, 1920, and beef, sheep and calves were steady to slightly higher.

Egg prices on AA grades and extra large advanced 2 cents and smaller sizes were up 1 cent a dozen wholesale yesterday.

Coming out here today we had the good fortune to be guided through the antelope refuge by the hospitable refuge keepers, Mr. and Mrs. Elmo Adams. Most of the time they lead what city folks might term a very dull, uneventful life, far from the bright lights and the noise of people. Once in a while, such as when the Order of Antelope clan gathers for its annual convention, or when they go to town for provisions, they rub elbows again. People who do their kind of a job must have a job for that sort of a thing, for they certainly can't find in monetary values any recompensation for living with antelope. Fortunately, there are the kind of people like Mr. and Mrs. Adams.

**Fleet-Footed Pronghorns**  
 Not far from Hart Mountain refuge headquarters we got our first glimpse of the fleet-footed pronghorns, and we mean fleet-footed. There is nothing these antelope would rather do than race around the sagebrush. They never seem to tire of a good race. By evening we saw them in bands of 15 and 20 near the road that winds to the Blue Sky hotel.

The antelope kid crop this year was better than it has been for several years. Bad weather in May and June, plus the heavy loss from coyotes, took a heavy toll in 1944 and 1945. The folks out at the refuge are keeping a close check on the fawns this year to see how they come out, but they know the coyote kill is again going to take a big toll of the young antelope.

Sage hens, too, are coming back. For a while they were almost extinct. There are deer in the mahogany below the ridges, and once along the road a band of wild horses swept along a ridge with their sleek manes flying in the wind. Nothing is more picturesque than a band of these wild horses, which are gradually disappearing from the ranges to make room for more domestic animals—sheep and cattle.

Yes, you'll see sheep and cattle grazing up on Hart mountain. Grazing permits have been granted under the Taylor Grazing Act for 2,500 head of sheep and 2,000 head of cattle. Good grazing land is valuable in this country, and the refuge has ample browse for all the wildlife on the refuge, as well as for additional livestock. It's just good, common sense to utilize this feed.

**Very Dry Season**  
 It has been very dry up here this year. Two weeks ago they had a snowstorm and a little rain, with 44 inches of precipitation recorded, but that's been the bulk of the moisture since the snows melted last spring.

From the Blue Sky hotel we can look off in the distance to Lone Grave Butte that marks the southeast corner of the refuge, and see the mountains rising up in Nevada about 12 miles south. There is also the almost obliterated trail of the old Oregon military road, and scattered around here and there several sections of unproductive land owned by Lake County. In the distance, the snow-capped Steen mountains can be seen in
